CWG-FHR: 11-13 October 2023

Background and Mandate

- 1. At its **2017 session, Council agreed** to principles for Resource Mobilization. In these principles, Council agreed: "As ITU's primary source of revenues, the top priority for Resource Mobilization is assessed contributions from ITU's Member States".
- 2. PP22 (Dec 5) instructs the ITU SG to: "develop an-ITU-wide resource mobilization strategy to address the need for additional funding to meet organizational priorities and present it to the Council for review and guidance on its implementation".
- 3. PP22 (Dec 5) Instructs the ITU Council: "to examine programmes aimed at increasing revenues, enhancing efficiency in the use of financial resources and reducing the costs of ITU drawn up by the Secretary-General with the assistance of the Coordination Committee".

Background and mandate continued...

- 4. During Council 2023 in July, the secretariat presented document C23/62 Rev1, which provided initial analysis and potential strategies regarding resource mobilization.
- 5. Council noted Document C23/62(Rev.1) and invited the Secretary-General to Report to CWG-FHR and to the Council on:
 - The refinement of the draft ITU-wide resource mobilization strategy and its implementation, as well as
 - How ITU could leverage the outcomes of the ITU World Café (C22/INF/13) held in 2022.

Potential Strategies Going Forward As per C23/62

Strengthen core membership offering to increase engagement and lay the foundation for Sector membership fee structure changes.

Develop ITU-wide thematic initiatives as complementary to membership, formalizing "extrabudgetary" contributions with multi-year commitments.

Pilot testing green digital action theme.

Leveraging standalone offerings to better capture and synergize value and impact.

i.e. popular events like Ai4G for ongoing support/ engagement.

ITU World Café – Revenue Generation Doc CWG-FHR 23/11

1. Member State Contributions:

Key pillar of ITU's financial stability. Encourage continued support.

Deliver across all areas to increase value

2. Cost Recovery:

Most CR revenues come from satellite filings and publications. Modernize to reflect changes in industry. Update at next CWG-FHR.

Leverage standalone offerings

3. Sector Membership

Highest level ever - almost 1K entities, increasingly diverse, but revenues stable – not growing. Analysis for next CWG-FHR.

Strengthen core membership offering

4. Voluntary contributions:

Strengthen internal capacity to bring extrabudgetary support to Member States. Address prerequisites – IT systems, processes, skills – as part of transformation plan.

Next Steps

Incorporate CWG-FHR feedback + prepare further analysis + intersectoral coordination + implementation of pilot initiative
