Credentials for delegations participating in the World Radiocommunication Conference (WRC-23), Dubai, United Arab Emirates, 20 November to 15 December 2023

Sir/Madam,

I am pleased to refer to Circular Letter No. 22/41 of 25 November 2022 inviting your Government to send a delegation to WRC-23. In order to assist you with your preparations for the Conference, I would like to draw your attention to the following.

Article 31 of ITU's Convention (see Annex 1) provides that any delegation sent by an ITU Member State to participate at a radiocommunication conference shall be accredited by means of instruments ("credentials document") signed by the Head of State, by the Head of Government, by the Minister for Foreign Affairs or by the Minister responsible for radiocommunication matters of the Member State concerned. The credentials document must fulfil at least one of the following criteria:

- confer full powers on the delegation;
- authorize the delegation to represent its government, without restrictions;
- give the delegation, or certain individual members thereof, the right to sign the Final Acts.

The original credentials document must be sent to the Secretary-General. Following established practice, credentials or transfers of power which do not meet the aforementioned requirements or which are sent only by fax or email are considered as not being in order. Under No. 333 of the ITU Convention, a delegation whose credentials are found not to be in order by the Plenary Meeting shall not be entitled to exercise its right to vote or to sign the Final Acts until such time as the situation has been rectified.

In light of the above, in order to enable your country to fully exercise its sovereign rights at WRC-23, I would invite you to ensure that the competent authorities in your country send the original credentials document to ITU headquarters in Geneva - accompanied, where necessary, by a certified translation in one of the official languages of the Union - before the opening of the conference, by registered letter, to the following address:

The original credentials document may also be deposited with the WRC-23 Credentials Committee secretariat <u>at the conference venue in Dubai, as from 17 November 2023</u>. A template of a credentials document which meets the criteria set out in the relevant provisions of the ITU Convention is annexed hereto (Annex 2) for your convenience; this same document may also be found on the WRC-23 website here.

Registration for WRC-23 will be open by June 2023. Please note that registration is an additional and separate requirement in the preparatory process and does not exempt Member States from having to submit an original credentials document.
