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New priorities – protection of minors

Key concerns:

Alarming rise of cyberbullying
Decline in mental health and well-being
Addictive design of online services

Driven by:

growing digitalisation of young people's social interactions, increased use of social media etc.

Effects:

profound impact on healthy relationships among minors, their mental health and trust in the digital environment



Digital Services Act (DSA)

Better internet for kids strategy (BIK+)

Age assurance & age verification



Digital Services Act

- Effective, Union-wide, horizontal and fully harmonised regulatory solution for the protection of minors online.
- Online platforms with less than 45 million users in the EU.
- 25 very large online platforms and search engines with more than 45 million users in the EU.
- 17 February 2024



















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Protection of minors in DSA – all platforms

 All platforms must ensure a high level of privacy, safety and security for minors.

RULES

Ban on targeted ads based on minors' personal data.

Terms and conditions must be easily understandable.

• Simple mechanisms to flag illegal content.

- Trusted flaggers.
- Ban on dark patterns.
- Contact point so users can communicate directly with the platform.
- Possibility to modify the recommender system.

Protection of minors in DSA – Very Large Online Platforms

- Analysis of systemic risks for example:
 - Spread of illegal content
 - Negative impact on children's rights
 - Adverse effects on the physical and mental well-being of persons
- Put in place effective measures against these risks.
- Annual independent audits.

Guidelines on the protection of minors under art. 28 DSA

Aim to:



- Assist providers of internet platforms to ensure a high level of privacy, safety and security for minors.
- Ensure harmonised application across the EU.
- The best interests of the child at the core when designing internet platforms' products, services and policies.
- Risk-based approach with child rights impact assessment.
- Non-exhaustive list of recommendations.
- Summer 2025

Protection of minors - key enforcement priority

- Investigations against TikTok, Facebook and Instagram focusing on addictive design, harmful content and age verification tools.
- 105 days after the start of the investigation, TikTok committed to permanently withdraw its reward programme in TikTok Lite in the EU.
- Requests for information to Pornhub, Xvideos and Stripchat related to the protection of minors.

- A comprehensive EU code of conduct on ageappropriate design
- Supporting a secure EUwide proof of age system

Age verification

Principles:

- A risk-based EU-approach to age verification
- To avoid national fragmentation and ensure interoperable solutions
- In cooperation with Member States, EDPB, ERGA.

Solutions:

- Short-term solution in the form of an Age Verification Appelore European Digital Identity Wallet is available to all EU citizens & residents by 2026
- Age verification long-term solution implemented in the European Digital Identity Wallet from 2026

Age verification – short term solution

- Contract to develop an age verification solution that will allow users to access age-restricted online services by verifying their age, without requiring them to share additional personal data:
 - support to the Member States to ensure uptake and publication of **localised versions** of the age verification application in app stores.
 - the development and integration of **Zero-Knowledge Pro**of (ZKP) functionality into the age verification solution to provide a fully privacy preserving method to exchange a proof of age attestation.
- Compatible with the EU Digital Identity Wallet.
- Available tentatively by mid-2025 for localisation and publishing by Member States.

- EU-wide inquiry on the impact of social media on well-being.
