Subject: **Invitation to the Seventh World Telecommunication/Information and Communication Technology Policy Forum (WTPF-26)**

Madam/Sir,

I have the honour to invite you to the Seventh World Telecommunication/Information and Communication Technology Policy Forum (WTPF-26), taking place in Nassau from 9 to 11 June 2026, preceded by a Strategic Dialogue on 8 June, at the kind invitation of the Government of the Commonwealth of The Bahamas.

The theme of WTPF-26 is “Accelerating an inclusive, sustainable, resilient and innovative digital future”. The WTPF is a unique global venue for high-level dialogue on telecommunication/ICT policy, and as a platform to address the opportunities and challenges arising from new and emerging technologies. Discussions will address key areas including bridging digital divides, green digital transformation, resilience of telecommunication/ICTs, space connectivity, and strengthening ICT-centric innovation ecosystems and entrepreneurship. The Forum is expected to adopt “Opinions” illustrating a shared vision among policy-makers worldwide on the future of the telecommunications and ICTs. In this regard, should you wish to address the Forum to present your vision on any of the themes addressed in the Secretary-General’s Report, I invite you to submit a request for speaking slots to deliver statements. If your delegation also plans to submit a contribution on the Secretary-General’s Report, we request that you include a brief reference to your contribution in your statement. Speaking slots will be allocated in accordance with ITU Protocol and on a first-come, first-served basis, with priority given to Ministerial and CEO-level interventions. As a Regulator of a ITU Member States, I am certain that your presence will enhance the importance of this Forum and signal the significance of the issues discussed. ### 1 Programme overview

A short scene-setting panel will precede each of the Working Group discussions on the draft opinions:

- Bridging digital divides, particularly on gender and age, as well as skills and connectivity
- Green digital transformation: climate change and environmental sustainability
- Resilience of telecommunication/ICTs
- Space connectivity, and
- Strengthening ICT-centric innovation ecosystems and entrepreneurship.

### 2 Speaking opportunities at the Forum

- **Tuesday, 9 June – Opinion 1:** *Bridging digital divides, particularly on gender and age as well as skills and connectivity*
- **Tuesday, 9 June and Wednesday, 10 June – Opinion 2:** *Green digital transformation and environmental sustainability*
- **Wednesday, 10 June – Opinion 3:** *Resilience of telecommunication/ICTs*
- **Wednesday, 10 June and Thursday, 11 June – Opinion 4:** *Space connectivity*
- **Thursday, 11 June – Opinion 5:** *Strengthening ICT-centric innovation ecosystems and entrepreneurship.*

Speaking slots can be requested online (TIES username and password required) on the WTPF-26 website. Slots will be allocated in accordance with ITU Protocol and on a first-come, first-served basis, with priority given to Ministerial and CEO-level interventions. Speaking time is limited to three minutes. Full statements will be posted on the Forum website.

### 3 Strategic Dialogue (8 June)

The Forum will be preceded by a Strategic Dialogue on 8 June that will bring together Ministers, policy-makers, industry leaders, and experts to exchange views on the Forum's themes and set the tone for subsequent discussions. Events include a High-level Multistakeholder Roundtable, panel discussions, and interactive exchanges, allowing participants to share experiences and best practices. Special attention will be given to the specific challenges and opportunities facing Small Island Developing States (SIDS).
