事由: 国际电联和世界卫生组织(WHO)关于电子卫生标准和互操作性的联合讲习班

2012年4月26-27日, 日内瓦

尊敬的先生/女士:

在整个世界范围内,卫生服务和卫生系统正在不断变革,反映出提高保健质量、安全性和成本效益的必要性。在实现上述变革的过程中,电子卫生的价值和贡献得到充分展现。随着各国对电子卫生的采用,他们将需利用整合医疗设备和信息系统传统的卫生系统。与此同时,由于只有基于开放的、全球统一的互操作性标准,电子卫生方可实现在个性化和一体化的无缝医疗保健方面的潜能,因此各国还需确保为各利益攸关方的创新奠定坚实基础。

在开发电子卫生标准和互操作框架方面已经付出了许多努力,但全面实施仍有待时日。 在未来一段时间内,仍需加强对这项工作的理解,了解所有利益攸关方的作用,这样才能更 好地利用相关资源,集中力量,消除差距。此外,还需制定清晰明确的电子卫生政策和战略 框架,从而为创建可持续发展的有利环境提供指导。

为实现上述目标,国际电联与世界卫生组织(WHO)一道,诚邀各卫生标准组织及其他利益攸关方参加将于2012年4月26-27日在日内瓦举办的讲习班,对目前已开展工作进行总结,讨论采用电子卫生所遇到的壁垒,并为国际电联和WHO制定用于指导未来行动的路线图献计献策。

在讲习班期间,讨论将根据背景文件和演示开展。

讲习班将于2012年4月26-27日在日内瓦国际电联总部举办,开始时间为第一天9:30。有关会议厅的详细信息将在国际电联总部各入口处的屏幕上显示。注册工作将自8:30在Montbrillant办公楼入口处开始(http://g.co/maps/gqapr)。

讲习班向国际电联成员、WHO成员国以及来自国际电联或WHO成员国的有意为此工作做出贡献的任何个人开放。这里所指的"个人"亦包括身为国际、区域和国家组织成员的个人。讲习班不收取任何注册费用。

Information on the Joint ITU-WHO Workshop on "e-Health Standards and Interoperability"

Objectives

The key workshop objective is to start a dialogue towards a comprehensive roadmap on global standards development, interoperability, and adoption for enabling the sustainable development of e-health services.

The resulting programs could leverage resources from regions, countries, industry, and research institutions, and provide a solid platform for harnessing future innovations within specific national e-health roadmaps.

The specific objectives of the Workshop are:

- Learn about different priorities of member states low-, middle- and high-income countries; and identify common threads amongst identified priorities / needs.
- 2. Share experience gained from programs and pilots needs, outcomes, barriers and next steps. This could be used to define specific use cases for which standards should be adopted, and to identify key elements of an e-health service architecture/framework specification.
- 3. Identify barriers to broad adoption of successful initiatives: A diagnosis and deep understanding of why standards are not used/applied in certain settings.
- 4. Assess transformative opportunities: Share advances in innovation that can transform delivery of healthcare (3-7 years). These include advances in mobile devices, portable medical devices, reengineered healthcare workflows, clinical decision support systems, new business models, and novel distribution / logistics strategies in the supply-chain.
- 5. To identify future needs, roles and responsibilities of stakeholders in advancing e-health standards.

Venue

The event will take place in ITU headquarters, Geneva, 26-27 April 2012 and it will open at 0930 hours. Detailed information concerning the meeting room will be displayed on screens at the entrances to ITU headquarters. Registration will open at 0830 hours at the Montbrillant entrance of the ITU building (http://g.co/maps/ggapr).

Language

Discussions will be held in English only.

Participation

Participation is open to ITU members and WHO Member States and to any individual from an ITU or WHO Member State who wishes to contribute to the work. This includes individuals who are also members of international, regional and national organizations. No registration fees required for participation.

Fellowships

ITU will provide a limited number of full fellowships to one participant per eligible country and within the available budget. The participant must be duly authorized by the respective ITU Administrations from Least Developed Countries and from developing countries with per-capita income under US\$ 2,000. While the provision of fellowship is limited to only one participant per country, the number of delegates from a country is not limited provided the expenses of additional delegates are borne by the country. Participants requiring a fellowship are requested to complete the Fellowship Request Form in Annex 4 and return it to the ITU by e-mail: bdtfellowships@itu.int or by fax to: +41 22 730 5778 by 26 March 2012 at the latest.

Visa

We would remind you that citizens of some countries are required to obtain a visa in order to enter and spend any time in Switzerland. The visa must be requested at least four (4) weeks before the date of beginning of the workshop and obtained from the office (embassy or consulate) representing Switzerland in your country or, if there is no such office in your country, from the one that is closest to the country of departure.

If problems are encountered by ITU Member States, Sector Members, Associates or Academic Institutions, and at the official request made by them to TSB, the Union can approach the competent Swiss authorities in order to facilitate delivery of the visa but only within the period mentioned of four weeks. Any such request should be made by official letter from the administration or entity you represent. This letter must specify the name and functions, date of birth, number, dates of issue and expiry of passport of the individual(s) for whom the visa(s) is/are requested and be accompanied by a copy of the notification of confirmation of registration approved for the ITU-T workshop in question, and must be sent to TSB by fax (+41 22 730 5853) or e-mail (tsbreg@itu.int), bearing the words "visa request". Please also note that ITU can assist only representatives of ITU Member States, ITU Sector Members, ITU Associates and ITU Academic Institutions.
