History of the CTU

- Established in 1989 in Nassau, The Bahamas by Caribbean Community (CARICOM) Ministers responsible for Telecommunications, to be the inter-governmental telecommunications policy instrument for the Caribbean
- 2003: Defined a new strategic direction to address issues of information and communications technologies (ICT)
- 2004: Expanded Membership to include Private sector organisations

Mission and Members

Mission:

→ To create an environment in partnership with members to optimize returns from ICT resources for the benefit of stakeholders.

Members:

- ◆ 19 State Members
- 1 Associate State Member
- 5 Non-State Members

Governance Structure (1)

- General Conference Ministers
 - Specifies the direction of the Union.
 - Convenes meets annually.

- Executive Council Permanent Secretaries and Technical Officers
 - Develops work plans for the Union
 - Convenes Executive Council Meets biannually.

Governance Structure (2)

- Technical Conference (Ad Hoc)-Technical Experts
 - Considers technical ICT issues
- The Secretariat
 - Implements work plan and directives issued by Executive Council

CTU Activities

- Policy Formulation -
 - ◆ Internet Governance.
 - Spectrum Management.
 - Other areas in ICT.
- Capacity Development -
 - Caribbean Centre of Excellence:
 - ICT Training Programmes, Technical Assistance, Caribbean ICT information.
- Representation at International Fora
 - ▶ ITU, ICANN, ARIN, LACNIC et al.

Guiding Principles for CTU Activities

- Caribbean Single Market and Economy (CSME)
 - Single Market Established in January 2006
 - Single Economy scheduled for 2008
- Full realization of CSME objectives requires
 - Establishment of ICT standards for the Caribbean.
 - Harmonization of regional policies and legislation.
 - Promotion of greater utilization of information and communication technology.

CTU Projects (1)

- Caribbean Spectrum Management Policy Reform -
 - ▶ Reform and harmonisation of existing practices and policies to reflect the evolution of wireless technologies and the needs of the Member States.

- Internet Governance -
 - Development of a policy framework for Caribbean Internet Governance.

CTU Projects (2)

- EU/ITU Caribbean ICT Harmonisation
 - Phase 1: Development of policies and guidelines (2008 - 2009).
 - Phase 2: Submission to sub regional organizations (2009 - 2010).
 - ◆ Phase 3: Implementation at the national level (2010 - 2011).

CTU Projects (3)

- Caribbean Centre of Excellence -
 - **▶** ICT Training.
 - → Technical Assistance.
 - Information Services.
 - Network of Experts.

CTU Projects (4)

- Connected Caribbean Initiative (CCI) -
 - To foster a Functional Caribbean Integration;
 - → To connect and strengthen organizations, communities and individuals working on or in support of a Functional Caribbean Integration;
 - To facilitate inter-working of Regional Governments;
 - → To provide a framework to foster development, integration and expansion of regional stakeholder groups; and
 - ◆ To support Caribbean Governments in achieving the Millennium Development Goals.

CTU Projects (5)

- CCI Scope of Works:
 - Data Gathering
 - Mobilization of Stakeholders Allocation of Responsibilities
 - Development of Standards
 - Regional harmonisation
 - Education and Public awareness
 - Demonstration Projects.

CCI Implementation (1)

- Phase 1 -
 - Survey and analysis of Caribbean ICT Initiatives and identification of best practices in the Region.
 - Development of standards to facilitate a Functional Caribbean integration.
 - Harmonisation of policies and legislation for the Caribbean ICT Sector.

CCI Implementation (2)

- Phase 2 -
 - Facilitating inter-working of Caribbean Government Ministries.
 - Public awareness, education and ICT training.
- Phase 3 -
 - Government, Business and communitybased applications and services.
 - Public awareness, education and ICT training.
