- WTSA-04, Florianópolis

- A Cybersecurity symposium was held one day before WTSA-04

- PP-06 (Antalya) Resolution 122

instructs the TSB Director

to consider ... organizing a worldwide standardization roundtable and coordination meeting, possibly in conjunction with WTSA, for one day immediately prior to the assembly

- Council 2007, in R.1271 (MOD)

resolves

that a worldwide standardization round table and coordination meeting ("Global Standardization Symposium") be convened on 20 October 2008 at the same venue as WTSA-08

GSS steering committee

■ TSAG, Feb 2007

- Created a correspondence group (tsagroundtable@itu.int) to work by electronic means on a series of questions
- Convened by Jean-Yves Monfort (France Telecom)

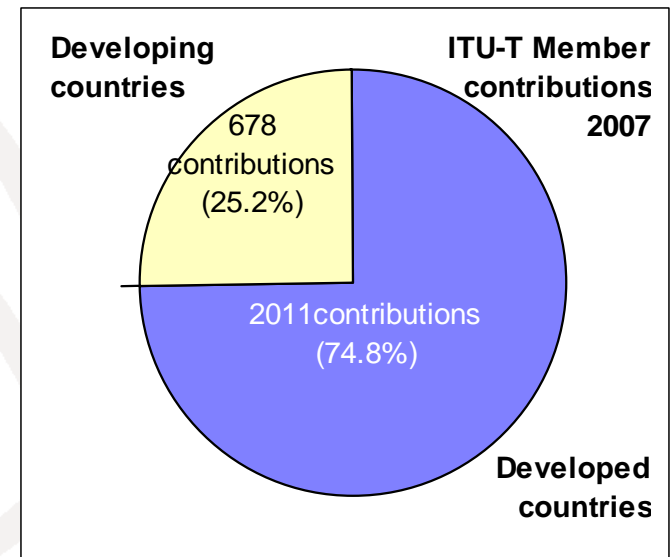
■ TSAG, Dec 2007
