<i>Title of the side event</i>	Means of Implementation and Global Partnership for Sustainable Development, the role of ICT
<i>Purpose of the side event</i>	This side event will serve as an opportunity to bring attention to all stakeholders in the post 2015 process to the importance of ICTs as a cross-cutting catalyst for the achievement and implementation of all three pillars of sustainable development (economic growth, social inclusion and environmental sustainability). ICTs are identified as an element of proposed SDG Goal 17 on the means of implementation (MOI) and as such are essential to the effective deployment of all SDG goals and targets. As well, the ICT sector provides a model of the global partnerships for sustainable development, which this negotiation session is attempting to implement in the post-2015 sustainable development agenda, particularly in developing countries.
