WHO IS ASIA-PACIFIC TELECOMMUNITY?

- An Intergovernmental Organization based on International Treaty;
- 38 Members, 4 Associate Members and 134 Affiliate Members (as of 17 March 2017);
- Covers Northeast Asia, Southeast Asia, South Asia and the Pacific;
- To foster the development of telecom. services and information infrastructure throughout the region.



OBJECTIVES OF APT

- Promote the expansion of telecomm. services and information infra. and the maximization of their benefits for the welfare of the people in the region;
- Develop regional cooperation in areas of common interest;
- Undertake studies relating to developments in telecomm. and information infra. technology and policy and regulation in coordination with others;
- Encourage technology transfer, human resource development and the exchange of information for the balanced their development;
- Facilitate coordination within the region with regard to major issues pertaining to telecomm. services and information infra.

APT ACTIVITIES RELEVANT TO RI OF ITU-ASP

- To organize fora to share information, best-practices and recommendations;
- To conduct studies to produce outcomes, such as (Technical) Recommendation, Report and Guideline;
- To conduct country specific projects through Extra Budgetary Contributions and Expert Mission;
- To provide Capacity Building Programme (Training and Expert Mission);
- To coordinate regional views on International conferences

ACONTRIBUTIONS TO ANY OF THE RI OF ITU-ASP

- APT facilitated to discuss and propose draft Regional Initiatives (2018-2021):
 - ASP1: Addressing special needs of LDCs, SIDS including Pacific island countries, and LLDCs;
 - ASP2: Harnessing ICTs to support the digital economy and an inclusive digital society;

- ASP3: Fostering development of infrastructure to enhance digital connectivity;
- ASP4: Enabling policy and regulatory environments;
- ASP5: Contributing to secure and resilient environment.

FUNDING AND RECOURSE MOBILIZATION

- Collaboration in organizing events in case audiences and topics are similar and expected synergy is larger than the cost;
- More detail collaborative arrangements for the country specific projects : role split, joint project, time lapse approach, etc.;
- Collaboration in Capacity Building Programmes;
- Working with funding institutions such as JICT/Japan, ADB, World Bank, etc.
