SUMMARY OF EXPOSURE

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Three times more disasters in 1990's than 1970's

*****Hazard impact every 4 ¹/₂ years

*****Affects **9%** of population

*****Damage and loss – 14% of GDP

*****40 events a year

*****US**\$** 3 billion losses



CDERA MANDATE

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 To make an immediate coordinated response by means of emergency disaster relief to an affected Participating State;

 To secure, coordinate and channel to interested inter-governmental and nongovernmental organisations reliable and comprehensive information on disasters affecting a Participating State;



CDERA MANDATE CONT'D

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 To mobilize and coordinate disaster relief from governmental and non-governmental organizations for affected PS

 To mitigate or eliminate, as far as practicable, the immediate consequences of disasters in Participating States

 To promote the establishment, enhancement and maintenance of disaster response capabilities among PS.

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
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CARIBBEAN CDM STRATEGY



Role of Disaster Information Systems in Various Phases of Disaster Management

- Risk & vulnerability identification
- Events database and risks assessment.
- Zoning of hazards using GIS.
- Hazard maps and other external data for accuracy in risk assessment.




Mitigation strategies and policies

- Fact based Mitigation strategies and policies
- Development of a virtual knowledge networks

- Preparedness for response & recovery
- Skilled human & material resources inventories.
- Database on human resources trained on various aspects of disaster management.

ISSUES AND RECOMMENDATIONS

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Limited or weak ICT infrastructure within most NDOs

• Embryonic common standards for use

Use and classification of hazard data

 Limited investment in infrastructure maintenance and updating



ISSUES AND RECOMMENDATIONS CONT'D

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Incipient ICT divide within and among organisations/institutions

 Misalignment between ICT systems and decision-making infrastructure

Infrastructure incompatability



WAY FORWARD

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 Greater interaction between system developers and users

 More investment in harvesting and utilization of existing ICT products in key sectors

 Build commitment to ICT use through strategic application



WAY FORWARD CONT'D

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 Structure ICT intervention as a medium and not the solution

 Build capacity for business continuity planning
