Young Innovators Forum

A leading platform for youth change-makers worldwide

On September 4th, over 100 talents aged between 18-35 years old from all over the world came together to learn how to build innovation ecosystems that creates real-life solutions for the digital transformation of their communities.

This four-day forum was created to positively impact the Global ICT community and to promote active participation of youth in the digital economy.

*This year the event hosted young ICT leaders from around 40 countries.
(118 young ICT leaders from 38 countries attended the event last year.)*



Innovation Challenge

An annual call for ideas

The journey started with the Young ICT leaders' (YILF) challenge 2018, inviting youth worldwide, age 18 to 35 to submit their ideas on how they might be creating an enabling environment to make their cities smarter.

The "YILF Challenge 2018" was an open competition platform for young people to present their ideas to solve issues facing smart cities' ecosystems.

Enabling a good ecosystem is essential to the development of digital technologies making a city smarter, safer, and friendlier to the environment, thereby improving the quality of life of the citizens.

Smart City of Busan

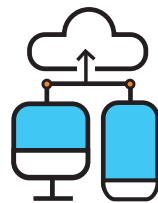
An adventure in a leading global smart city

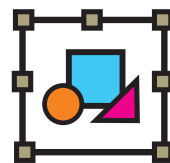
Busan is:

The International Telecommunication Union, the United Nation's specialized agency for ICT co-hosted the Young ICT Leaders Forum 2018 along with the smart city of Busan, the creative economy and innovation center of the Republic of Korea. This initiative has allowed young innovators and trendsetters to come together and improve their communities with smart cities through capacity building and network.



Capability Building

Trained to use tools to build ICT centric ecosystem

The first two days of this unique four-day event were focused on building capacities and networking.

Day 1 and 2

The forum was honoured by the presence of governments and industry leaders **Mr. Dai Young Jung**, **Mr. Mohamed Ba**, chief moderator of the event and head of innovation at ITU, and **Mr. Ioane Koroivuki**, regional director of ITU Asia and the Pacific.



The **5th edition of the Young ICT Leaders’ Forum** was officially launched by Mr. Ioane Koroivuki in his opening speech.

Participants were welcomed with the inspiring words of Mr. Mohamed Ba who shared his passion and expertise in technology and innovation with the audience, and kicked off the intensive 4 days program.



The first two days were dedicated to **building an ICT innovation ecosystem** process in which the **young ICT leaders** used the unique toolkit exclusively developed by the ITU to strengthen ICT centric ecosystems.

Teams were created according to the represented regions at the event and were asked to explore real-life challenges and opportunities to develop smart cities in a multi-stakeholder vision, defining potential barriers and implementing preliminary solutions.

To **finalize their projects**, each group had to submit a final proposal, one of which was selected and presented on the third day; day of the forum event.



Sharing the Knowledge

Empowered with experts exchange



On the third day, participants received their diplomas in recognition of their ICT innovation ecosystem acquired skills and had the unique opportunity to exchange with high profile Smart City leaders and officials.

Day 3

Outstanding presentations and award ceremonies marked the third day of the forum. Participants received their certificates while Mr. Mohamed Ba and Mr. Ioane Koroivuki’s encouraging words acknowledged their outstanding levels of commitment as global ICT leaders.

The event was followed by the guest speakers’ session, the first subject being introduced by Mr Kyong Yul Lee, Secretary General of WeGo, and ITU Regional Director of Asia and The Pacific, Mr Ioane Koroivuki on “Building Smart Cities being a supportive technology ecosystem”. Professor Dae Young Kim , Mr. David Shelter, Mr. Pavel Laletin and Mr Chae Gun Chung, head of United Nations Project Office on Governance (UNPOG) demonstrated the importance of innovation ecosystems as drivers of ICT smart cities; a topic that led to animated discussions with the audience.

Before closing the ceremony, the project winning team was given the opportunity to present its work on building a single stakeholder vision ecosystem. The other participants' proposals were given a brief introduction.

As one of the drivers of innovation is empathy, the young talents were asked to, as a last exercise, engage with stakeholders' needs and goals to start active collaborations from the same common ground.

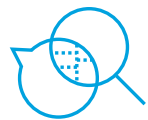


Networking

The young leaders were invited to explore the developments of this initiative and visit at the same time the Busan IT Industry Promotion Agency, the Busan Centre for Creative Economy & Innovation and Smart City Exhibition Centre.

This communication and exchange space is dedicated to stimulate Busan's creative economy. It acts as an agent to inspire entrepreneurs and turn their ideas into real startups by providing exchange space that help businesses flourish.

Smart City Exhibition Centre

The centre provides a development environment (i.e. Open lab, Application Programming Interfaces (API), Software Development Kits (SDK) and technical support for developing and testing various services by using public and private data. The support centre in the Test Bed helps manage the city platform operated by the private and public sectors. It also provides infrastructure to support programs managed by global companies providing small and medium business with the necessary mentoring and development.

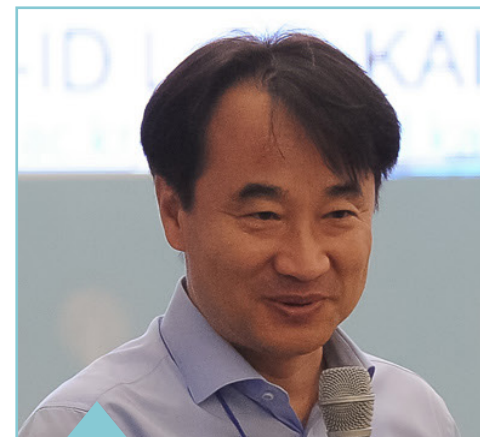

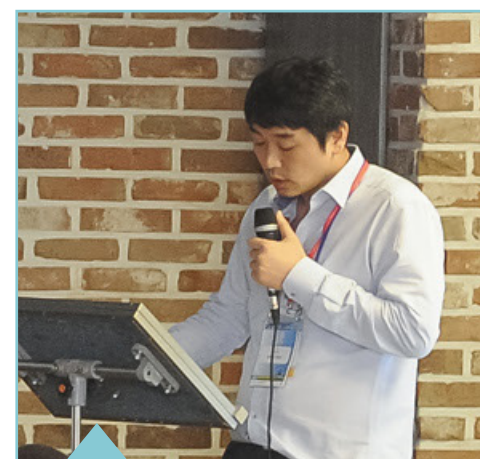
