The "Accelerera Youth: Digital Transformation and Inclusion in Africa" initiative, led by the Coalition of Youth from Portuguese-Speaking African Countries (CJP), is a comprehensive programme aimed at catalysing digital transformation across the African continent, with a specific focus on the Portuguese-Speaking African Countries (PALOP). The initiative is committed to fostering inclusive ecosystems of innovation and ensuring that no one is left behind in the digital revolution.

Objective

The fundamental objective of the initiative is to foster sustainable economic growth, social inclusion, and technological development throughout Africa. This will be achieved through the acceleration of the adoption of cutting-edge digital technologies and the establishment of robust innovation ecosystems that empower local populations and promote the development of relevant technological solutions.

Key Goals and Actions

inequalities and promoting gender inclusion in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) and related fields.

Support for Startups and Inclusive Innovation: A comprehensive network of startup incubators and accelerators will be established across Africa, with a special emphasis on PALOP countries and promoting diversity and inclusion. These entities will provide critical resources, mentorship, and funding for entrepreneurs from all backgrounds.

Public-Private Partnerships: The initiative will facilitate strategic collaboration between governments, private sector companies, and non-profit organisations to develop technological solutions that address specific challenges in Africa, including gender and equality issues.

Investment in Inclusive Research and Development (R&D): Substantial resources will be allocated to research institutions, universities, and innovation centres to conduct advanced research and development projects in emerging technologies, promoting gender equality in scientific research.

Favourable and Inclusive Policies and Regulations: Close cooperation with African governments will be established to develop policies and regulations that encourage innovation, protect intellectual property, and ensure digital security, with a special focus on gender equality and inclusion.

Promotion of Digital Awareness and Gender Equality: Comprehensive educational campaigns will be launched across Africa, with a particular focus on PALOP countries and the promotion of gender equality. These campaigns will increase awareness of the benefits of digital transformation and actively encourage women's participation in technology.
