#### Objectives:

1. To introduce private sector participants (producers such as importers, distributors, and manufacturers etc.) to basics and key elements of e-waste and circular economy.
2. To acquaint the private sector participants to the project and in implementing/enforcing extended producer responsibility (EPR) regulations once revised.
3. To engage producers and get their commitment on the key provisions regarding the regulation of EPR in Zambia, including exploring the potential business opportunities in the sector arising from these.
4. To identify best practices including the possible financing mechanisms, roles & responsibility, and barriers to be overcome to enhance public-private sector cooperation and to achieve optimal management of e-waste in the future.
5. To generate momentum around the e-waste issue, such as through media reporting.
