

GENERAL INFORMATION

México City, formerly known as the “City of Palaces”, was founded in 1525 by the Spanish conquerors, after defeating the Aztecs built a new city on the ruins of Tenochtitlan, the Aztec Empire headquarters.

As in a mosaic, each of the main areas of Mexico City hosts a great cultural syncretism. In each of them, archeological sites, historical buildings, contemporary constructions, cultural centers and parks share the same space. This impressive city also boasts a wide variety of museums including the National Museum of Anthropology and History, the National Museum of Art, the Blue House of Diego Rivera and Frida Kahlo, and the Museum of Modern art.

Thanks to the fact that the city sits in the Central Highlands, at an altitude of 2,240 meters above sea level, its inhabitants enjoy a temperate climate almost all year. In addition to be the capital of the Mexican Republic, the city is the economic heart of the country, and seat of the federal powers of the union. For more information see: www.visitmexico.com

Exchange rate (May 18th 2017): \$18.88 = 1 USD


Banks are open from 9:00 to 16:00 hours from Monday to Friday.

Temperatures in Mexico City in September averages ranging around 20° C, with little chance of rain. This year sees a maximum temperature of 23° and a minimum temperature of 11°, for the days 20, 21 y 22.

POWER

Mexico City uses electric current of 110-120 Volts / 60 Hz



LANGUAGE

The official language is Spanish.

PASSPORTS AND VISA

Foreigners travelling to Mexico must have a valid Passport, issued by the competent authority. In order to meet the requirements, procedures and criteria for the attention to and resolution of visa application procedure, it is recommended that participants consult the web site of the National Institute of Migration, www.gob.mx/inm.
