### **VISA PROCEDURE**

A valid passport is required to enter Djibouti. In this case, participants are strongly advised to seek information on requirements applicable in their case from the Djibouti Embassy / Consulate in their home countries at least 15 days prior to the trip.

In case there is no Embassy or Consulate of Djibouti in your country, it is recommended to send, at least three weeks before the events a clear scanned copy of your passport to the host country Coordinator in order to assist in issuing your visa. Please note that the host country will not ensure any request that comes after this period.

The following documents are required:

- Valid passport.
- A round-trip airline.
- Hotel booking in your name or in the name of the person with whom you will be staying, including the address/phone number of your place of stay.

#### **COMMUNICATIONS**

The telephone network operated by the national telecommunication organization (Djibouti Telecom). The international dial code for Djibouti is +253. Discounts rates for international direct calls apply from 8 p.m. to 7 a.m. and all day on Fridays and public holidays. There is a complete list of rates at the back of each telephone directory.

### **MOBILE PHONES IN Djibouti**

Please keep in mind that typically in Europe, Middle East and Asia most telecom providers use the 900 MHz and 1800 MHz bands. If you wish to use your own mobile phone in Djibouti, you should verify in advance that your phone supports the 900 MHz and 1800 MHz bands.

### TRANSPORTATION FOR PARTICIPANTS

Transfers between Djibouti International Airport and official hotels will be provided to participants who have provided <u>their flight details</u> through the identified channels. They will be greeted on arrival by an authorized representative in the arrival hall of the airport.

### **CURRENCY**

The official currency of the Djibouti is the Djiboutian franc (FDJ). Each Franc is held constant against the US Dollar at an average of 175.70. All banks operate from 8.00am to 12.00pm, Sunday through Thursday and 4.00pm to 6.00pm, Sunday and Wednesday. Currency exchange houses are open until late in the evening. The international credit and debit cards are widely accepted.

### **CLIMATE**

Djibouti enjoys pleasant weather during its winter months, from October to April. The rest of the year, temperatures are in the low to mid-40° range. Lightweight summer clothing can be worn for most of the year. For weather forecasts, please visit:

#### **SECURITY**

Djibouti is a venue for major conferences and presents a low risk to business travelers. However, as with travel to any major city, it is important to take responsibility for your personal safety and exercise common sense security precautions at all times.







Delegates should observe common sense security precautions and not venture outside the main business and tourist areas unless accompanied by a trusted local guide. For any security incident, visitors should contact the police on 17.

### **ELECTRICITY**

Domestic supply is 220 volts. Sockets suitable for two-pin 13 amp plugs of French standard design are the norm, however it is a good idea to bring an adaptor with you just in case. Adaptors can be purchased in local supermarkets.

### **ABOUT Djibouti**

The Republic of Djibouti, located at the southern entrance to the Red Sea covers an area of 23,000 km2 with 370 km of coastline and a population of 900,000 inhabitants, about two-thirds lives in the capital, Djibouti. The rest of the population lives mainly in secondary cities. Country shares borders with Ethiopia, Eritrea and Somalia. However, the actual growth rate is significantly higher (6%) due to the presence of refugees in the country. The climate is desert-like and temperatures are high.
