



## **Information Session:**

# **Enhanced collaboration and partnership between the UNRC/UNCT and the International Telecommunications Union (ITU) in the Arab Region**

**18 February 2021 12:00 – 14:00 hrs (Cairo Local Time)**

The International Telecommunication Union (ITU) is organizing an information session on enhanced collaboration and partnership between the United Nations Resident Coordinators (UNRC)/UN Country Teams and ITU in the Arab region on the 18<sup>th</sup> of February 2021 online.

The COVID-19 pandemic impacted the Arab region on unprecedented levels as close to five million confirmed cases and around 85 500 deaths were reported across the region by the 9<sup>th</sup> of February 2021 according to WHO. Moreover, the economic and social impacts were also devastating as according to UNESCWA the Arab region will lose around \$42 Billion of income as well as losing around 1.7 million jobs by the end of 2020. It is important to highlight that these numbers impact the most vulnerable segments of societies and evidently the least connected.

The Arab region was fortunate in the past few years to take long strides in deploying information and communication technologies enabling around 91% of the population to be covered by a 3G or higher broadband network and around 100.6% of the population to have a mobile subscription by 2019. However, in spite of these achievements in ICT infrastructure there still remains around half of the population unconnected to the internet (largely due to social and economic factors). This number increases when looking at the situation with Least Developing Countries or even marginalized segments of society across the region. More significantly, it is quite clear that countries who are more connected have reaped great benefits across all sectors of the digital economy, and vice-versa. In addition, countries who were more connected, evidently, were better prepared and were able to efficiently manage the COVID-19 pandemic by handling misinformation, tracking the virus, providing insights to policy makers and sustaining critical sectors such as education.

In recognition of the critical role digital technology and connectivity play in accelerating the achievement of sustainable development and COVID response and recovery, the Secretary-General issued the Roadmap for Digital Cooperation in July 2020 with the aim to facilitate the development of partnerships and cooperation around the identified 8 pillars of the Roadmap.

This information session aims to 1) provide the UNRCs with an overview of ITU's work and activities and 2) discuss with the UNRCs how and where ITU's support and engagement could be strengthened to implement the Roadmap and accelerate the achievement of SDGs.

This online engagement session will be interactive, beginning with the presentation of ITU activities in the region, moving on to discussions with UNRCs on potential areas of support and engagement.
