I-CoDI Regional Workshop: The New ITU Arab Regional Initiatives

19 – 22 November 2024, Dubai, United Arab Emirates

Organised by the Telecommunications and Digital Government Regulatory Authority and the International Telecommunications Union

Context and Background

In line with the strategic partnership between the TDRA and the ITU to accelerate digital innovation through the ICodi Initiative, this workshop is organised as a preparatory step for the World Telecommunication Development Conference (WTDC) 2025. The primary aim is to support Member States in identifying the next set of regional priorities that can shape the new Regional Initiatives for the Arab Region, which will guide ITU's work in the region from 2025 to 2028.

This workshop will bring together participants from Member States and ecosystem stakeholder groups — including the public sector, private sector, academia, finance, innovators, and support networks — to co-create the new regional priorities for the Arab region.

Using established methodologies and strategic frameworks, participants will collaborate to assess current and future trends, as well as potential risks and opportunities within the region, to identify regional priorities and develop robust, resilient, and impactful recommendations. This workshop complements Member States' efforts to draft the ITU Arab Regional Initiative ahead of the upcoming WTDC, scheduled to take place from 17 to 28 November 2025 in Baku, Azerbaijan.

The gradual transition towards a digital society has been widely recognised as essential for sustainable and inclusive development in the 21st century. In June 2020, the UN Secretary-General launched a Roadmap for Digital Cooperation, acknowledging the importance of a multistakeholder approach to foster a safer and more equitable digital world. This roadmap outlines eight areas of action, focusing on universal connectivity, promoting digital public goods, digital inclusion, strengthening digital capacity-building, protecting human rights in the digital era, supporting global cooperation on AI, fostering trust and security in the digital environment, and building a more effective architecture for digital cooperation. Additionally, at the Summit of the Future, a Global Digital Compact was endorsed to “outline shared principles for an open, free, and secure digital future for all.” In this context, innovation and digitalisation have been identified as key "enablers" for achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in the region.



Workshop Overview

This four-day interactive workshop will bring together diverse stakeholders from key sectors to collaborate in a strategic foresight exercise aimed at shaping the region's ecosystem for a digitally ready future. Through these collaborative sessions, participants will identify priority areas to inform the development of the new regional initiatives. High-level attendees are expected to include representatives from relevant ministries and regulators across Member States, as well as from UN agencies, international and regional organisations, the private sector, academia, finance, innovators, and support networks within the region.

The workshop will be conducted in English, and hosted at the TDRA office in Dubai, UAE.

The objectives of the workshop are:

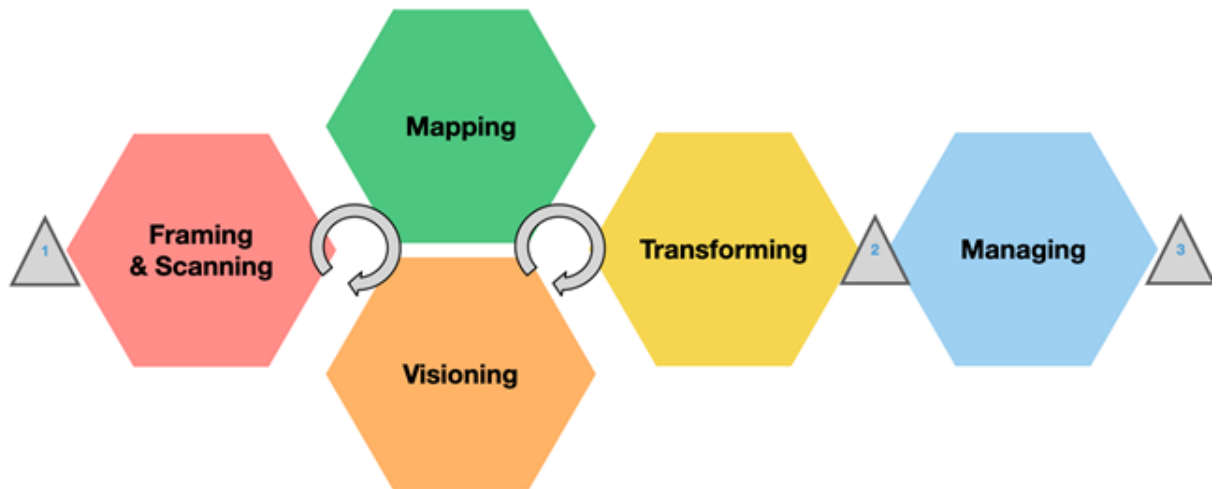
1. Define the priorities that will inform the formulation of the ITU Arab Regional Priorities for 2025-2028, using strategic foresight analysis to shape new regional initiatives for the Arab States. This process will consider the unique needs of both developed and developing countries within the region, along with the resources and key factors necessary to ensure these priorities are relevant, strategic, and impactful for all Member States.
2. Utilise ITU's methodology for strategic foresight to foster a futures-thinking approach and develop skills in strategic foresight. This approach will empower stakeholders to detect environmental signals, map trends, anticipate disruptions, explore multiple possible futures, and create resilient systems that guide stakeholders in building a roadmap toward desired outcomes.

Outputs

The primary outputs of the workshop will be twofold:

1. **Strategic Foresight Analysis:** A comprehensive analysis that employs a systematic approach to anticipate, prepare for, and navigate future uncertainties. This will enable informed decision-making and proactive adaptation to emerging trends and challenges.
2. **Identification of Regional Priorities:** Identification of at least five key regional priorities that could shape the ITU Regional Initiatives for 2025-2028. In addition, participants will co-create recommendations to guide the evolution of these priorities, ensuring they remain relevant and impactful for the future.

Co-Creation Approach



Over the four-day workshop, participants will engage in a structured strategic foresight exercise, guided by co-creation tools, designed to identify priorities that will help in the formulation of the ITU Arab Regional Initiatives. The collaborative activities will include:

- a. **Framing and Scanning the Environment:** Participants will examine the current landscape to identify critical signals and emerging trends, setting a foundation for understanding the factors shaping the region's digital ecosystem.
- b. **Mapping Trends and Drivers:** Through in-depth analysis, participants will assess the impact and uncertainty of key signals, trends, and drivers, helping to evaluate how these elements could influence various future scenarios for the region.
- c. **Envisioning Future Scenarios:** Participants will create and explore multiple future scenarios, assessing their implications for the regional ecosystem and prioritising the scenarios that align most closely with the desired digital future for the Arab States.
- d. **Transforming the Future Vision into a Strategic Action Plan:** The insights from the scenarios will guide the creation of a shared vision for the future, along with a concrete action plan that outlines the steps needed to achieve this vision.
- e. **Managing the Action Plan through the Establishment of Supportive Mechanisms:** Finally, participants will gain an understanding of mechanisms and systems to support and manage the strategic actions, ensuring sustainable implementation of the regional priorities and fostering resilience within the ecosystem.
