This remarkable improvement is a result of various factors; among them is the significant increase of mobile broadband subscriptions since the 3G network deployed in Thailand earlier last year.

Therefore, the MIS report is very important to all the countries to be able to pinpoint where they are and how they should plan their move in the Information World.
