

History and Achievement

- ✓ In 2002, Korean Government started IAC project and since then a total of 38 IACs have been established in 36 countries - 2 in Vietnam & Indonesia)
- ✓ In 2006, Korean Government started IAC upgrades & renovation
- ➤ Since then 18 IACs have been renovated/upgraded after 4 years







IAC Project Overview

Helping to Reduce the Digital Divide

- As a subsidiary organization under the Ministry of Science, ICT and Future Planning (MSIP), NIA has tried to reduce the information gaps between individuals both domestically and internationally
- ➤ NIA has carried out the IAC project providing better access and opportunity to use ICTs for the general public in developing countries



IAC Regional Knowledge Portal: Background

Background

Strong demand for accurate and updated ICT information (Laws, Acts, Policies, etc...) at any time and from anywhere

Overview

- To create an Internet-based repository on ICT Information in Korea and make available throughout the IAC network
- ➤ To be developed as a comprehensive, cost-effective, user-friendly, and interactive knowledge-based portal (don't need to build from scratch → just use updated technologies)
- ➤ To be developed, financed and maintained by NIA (Korean Gov't) who will gather and provide on their own ICT information that could be useful and beneficial for IAC regional members
- Encourage ADB regional member countries to share amongst themselves
- ➤ Incentives possibly provided and share contents (e.g. awards from ADB, ITU)



Koll Program by Year (1998~2013)







Sending IT skilled volunteers to partner countries to help improve IT capacity (552 KIVs to 30 countries in 2013)






