1. Good Projects in the Past

- Livelihood Database
- 1. Sustainable Livelihoods for Affected Communities (Indonesia)
- ✓ Improved the livelihoods of coastal communities affected by 2004 earthquake and tsunami.



"Over 4,000 registered members can benefit from Livelihood Members Database for production results, and connections to buyers or markets, by utilizing digitally accumulated data."

- Rice Knowledge Bank



2. Improving Poor Farmers' Livelihoods Through Rice Information Technology (Cambodia, Thailand, and Vietnam)

✓ Improved the livelihood of poor farmers through application of agricultural information, using **Rice Knowledge Bank**, a digital service of IRRI.

"Almost 5,000 farmer intermediaries were trained to use the digital service."

2. Ongoing Projects

- Digitally Automated Customs Management System
- 3. Supporting Participation in the South Asia Subregional Economic Cooperation Trade Facilitation (Bhutan, Bangladesh and Nepal)
- ✓ Strengthens the technical and institutional capacity of three countries' customs.
- ✓ Promotes effective operations of <u>digitally automated customs</u> <u>management system</u>.









3. ADB and JFPR

- JFPR was established in 2000 to support ADB's fight against poverty.
- JFPR aims to reduce poverty and support capacitybuilding efforts in DMCs.

Modalities

JFPR

Loan (large scale)

Grant (broader scope in terms of sectors, and can support more traditional approaches)

TA (PPTA, CDTA, PATA and RDTA)

	Grant (poverty reduction focus, and innovative approaches)	161 projects (\$ 464 mil) From 2000 to 2013
	TA (mainly support CDTA)	147 projects (\$ 159 mil) From 2009 to 2013

The Government of Japan approves the project




ADB approves the project





5. JFPR TA

• Maximum Amount per project: \$2 million



• JFPR TA requires alignment with MDBs and ADB's Strategy





6. JFPR Grant

Maximum Amount per project: \$3 million

As Key features, JFPR Grant

- Supports poverty reduction with capacity development activities
- Encourages innovative approaches


In addition, it

- Requires alignment with Japanese bilateral assistance
- Promotes ownership of local people
- Encourages direct participation of NGOs





Number of TAs Approved in 2010-2013 by Country










Number of Grants Approved in 2010-2013 by Country
