- Safe and Secure Society through ICT;
- Trust and Confidence in ICT;
- Sustainable ICT Ecosystem for Innovation;
- Capacity Building and Institutional Development; and
- Fostering Regional Cooperation for ICT Development.

These key priority areas have guided the works of APT to assist its members to realize digital economy and society. The Brunei Darussalam Statement was further reaffirmed by APT Strategic Plan for 2015–2017 and all APT Work Programmes have dedicated to the development of digital economy and society.

Taking into account these six key priorities areas from the Brunei Darussalam Statement as well as ICT trends and developments in recent years, APT is now preparing our Strategic Plan for 2018–2020 which will be proposed for approval by the 14th Session of General Assembly of APT at the end of this year.

In order to make APT in line with the digital economy and society context, Member Administrations of APT proposed five strategic pillars, namely: Connectivity, Innovation, Trust, Capacity Building, and Partnership. With these strategic pillars, APT will assist our members to address the challenges towards digital economy and society.

Since its first inception in 2015, the Digital Society Policy Forum has gathered various stakeholders including government officials and industry representatives to discuss on national plans to build digital societies, role of spectrum policy and licensing for mobile broadband, cybersecurity, digital financial services and ICT innovations.

The topics to be discussed at this Forum this year, such as policy and regulatory measures ensuring hyper-connected society, digital innovation promotion and other emerging issues are quite relevant to address the challenges we are now facing. As such, I hope there will be fruitful discussion in every session of this Forum both today and tomorrow.
