

### Kiribati Profile

- Officially the Republic of Kiribati
- ▶ Population: 110,136 (2015) with more than half residing on Tarawa
- 800 square km of total land area
- ▶ 3.5million square km of ocean
- > 3 group of islands namely Gilbert, Phoenix and Line Group
- > 33 atolls and reef islands and 1 raised coral island

### **Telecom Network Status**

- Communications Act 2012
- Open telecommunications market
- ▶ 2 licensed mobile service providers
  - ▶ 1 operational mobile service provider (ATHKL)
  - ▶ Other provider yet to provide services, hopefully within the next months
- ▶ 1 Wifi internet service provider




### **Telecom Network Status**

- Fixed
  - Prepaid: 775 (2017), peaked in 2013 at 4700
  - ▶ Post Paid: 80
- Mobile
  - ➤ Active subscribers: 52,000 (Q1 2017) from 16,000 in 2014
- Broadband users
  - Leased lines: 30 users



### **Telecom Network Status**

- Number of Islands connected
  - ► 4G/LTE connection: 1 island
  - > 3G connection: 5 islands
  - > 2G connection: 3 islands
- Number of sites
  - ▶ 9 x 4G/LTE sites
  - ▶ 8 x 3G sites
  - > 3 x 2G sites



## International Connectivity

- Satellite connectivity
  - ► O3B on Tarawa only
  - ➤ Satellites (ABS, INTELSAT etc)





# Plans to enhance access, bandwidth and speed of connectivity

- Mobile and internet services rollout to outer islands (rural), commencing in 2017 and expected to complete by 2019
- Submarine cable projects to main islands centers
  - ► Tarawa Mid 2019 (World Bank)
  - Kiritimati Early 2019 (Asian Development Bank)
- Submarine cable to 3 outer islands project tbc
- ► Tarawa terrestrial fiber optics project end of 2018




## Kiribati Connectivity Project








### Planned Outer Islands submarine cable







## Price of internet access and international bandwidth

- International Bandwidth
  - ► AU \$260,000 per month (earlier this year)
  - ▶ 150Mbps (earlier this year)
- Internet access
  - ▶ Mobile data plan: ~ \$0.01 per MB (daily and weekly), \$0.02 for monthly
  - ▶ Outside of plan: \$0.99 per MB
  - ► Flashnet/Wifi/Router Plan: ~\$0.02 \$0.03 per MB
  - ► IPVPN: \$800/Mbps (uncapped)



### Policies and regulations

- ► The National ICT Policy 2011 encourages Government to explore submarine fiber optic cable connections to Kiribati
- ► The Communications Act 2012 is also supportive of enhanced international connectivity



## Challenges with access to submarine cables

- Remoteness of country to major cable routes
- Scattered islands (3 island groups)
- Funding
- Population size on each island
- ► High Throughput Satellites technologies
- ► Limited human resources and capacity
