Prior to joining the United Nations system, Ms. Romanoff also worked in the private sector as a commercial contracting and litigation attorney at New York and Ukrainian law firms. She started her career the Department of Justice in Odessa, Ukraine, and the Kiev District Court in Odessa, Ukraine.
