7. Currency

National currency unit in the Republic of Tajikistan is Tajikistan Sumoni (TJS). All payments are effected in the national currency. Currency exchange offices are available in all cities. Foreign currency can be changed in exchange offices in hotels and banks.

As of 7 May 2018, TJS exchange rate was as following:

1 USD = 8.9796 TJS; 1 EUR = 10.7468 TJS

8. Banks

Banks are open from 8:00 a.m. till 16:00 p.m., Monday to Friday. Currency exchange is carried out by all banks and exchange offices.

9. Climate

The climate of Tajikistan is sharply continental, on the edge of subtropical and temperate zones, conditioned by geographic location of the country inside Eurasian mainland. In general, it is subtropical with significant diurnal temperature variation, small precipitation quantity, dry air and small cloud amount. In May, average daily temperature is +27°C, average night temperature - +13°C.

10. Time

Time in Tajikistan is 5 hours ahead of Greenwich Mean Time (GMT+5).

11. Electricity

The standard supply is 220 V, 50 Hz, C.A. Outlets for 220 Vs are available at the hotels.

12. Telecommunications

Telephone code of Dushanbe is +992 37. For international calls from Dushanbe one should dial 8 10 + code of the country + code of the city or follow the instructions on telephone card.

The Workshop participants can get Internet access in the respective hotels and at the event venue.

13. Visa

Based on bilateral and multilateral visa free arrangements, citizens of the Republic of Azerbaijan, Republic of Armenia, Republic of Belarus, Georgia, Republic of Kazakhstan, Kyrgyz Republic, Republic of Moldova, Russia, and Ukraine can enter the territory of the Republic of Tajikistan with general civil passport for up to 90 days; citizens of the Republic of Uzbekistan with diplomatic passports for up to 30 days; citizens of Turkmenistan with diplomatic and service passports for up to 30 days.

For citizens of other 80 countries, a simplified visa receipt order is foreseen, when visa requests are considered within 3 working days.

Those participants who need entry **visa** to the Republic of Tajikistan are recommended to contact their local Embassy/Consulate of the Republic of Uzbekistan for information well in advance.

14. General information

Tajikistan is a mountainous, landlocked country in Central Asia with. It is bordered by Afghanistan to the south, Uzbekistan to the west, Kyrgyzstan to the north, and China to the east. Traditional homelands of Tajik people included present-day Tajikistan, Afghanistan and Uzbekistan.

Mountains cover more than 90% of the country. It has a transition economy that is highly dependent on remittances, aluminium and cotton production.

Dushanbe is the capital and largest city of Tajikistan, which is located 38 degrees north latitude and 68 degrees eastern longitude in populous and fertile Hissar Valley, at the height of 750 to 930 m above sea level. The area of Dushanbe is 127 km². The river of Varzob, feeding the artificial sea Komsomolkoye in the centre of Dushanbe, flows over the city from north to south, while the river of Kafirnigan flows over the city from east to west. Varzob gorge with numerous recreation facilities is located north of Dushanbe.

The Dushanbe seismic intensity is quite high and was estimated at the level of 7 to 8 degrees, according to design standards of 20th century. Earthquakes are observed by Earthquake Detection Station of Dushanbe.
