


CYBERSECURITY IN ROMANIA CONFERENCE

The initiator and the conference concept

With 5 employees and a dozen of contracted professors and external collaborators, **Swiss Webacademy** (SWA) is a Sibiu-based non-profit Romanian-Swiss NGO, which aims to provide high-quality courses and products in the IT domain.

Placed under the Honorable Presidency of the Swiss Ambassador to Romania, SWA's top priorities, besides offering top courses and services, are to play a significant role in the local, national and international civil society, bringing knowledge, culture and dialogue at the heart of its core projects.

Analyzing the current panorama of IT security in Romania, we thought the best service and innovation we could bring to the Romanian society is to implement a Swiss core concept, vital for any country, meaning a **non-profit**, **non-marketing** and **"non-technical" public-private dialogue platform**, **with an international dimension**.

With the Swiss Embassy as a warrant of neutrality, we intend to create the ideal premises for private persons, entrepreneurs, IT security firms and State services for dialogue and networking.





How did it started?

In **2010**, Daniela Chrzanovski, CEO of the Swiss Webacademy (formerly aka "Romanian-Swiss Multimedia Institute"), launched in Bucharest **two very useful Romanian-Swiss fora**, in partnership with the Romanian Ministries of Justice and Foreign Affairs, the National Institute of Magistracy and Institute Against Economic Crime (ILCE - Haute École Arc).

The feedbacks were positive. The two meetings were designed as *closed-doors events*, except for the opening, that were not opened to civil society or private companies. They were focused mainly on two exclusive Romanian state tasks (Justice and Police). **The conclusion was, that if as an NGO wanted to be really useful to the society, the concept had to be adapted and broadened.**














The spark: the MAN who made the "small miracle" possible



In June 2013, Swiss Webacademy was charged by the Romanian Mission to the UN Geneva to set up an awareness-raising exhibition opened in honor of the nomination of Mr. Catalin Marinescu (ANCOM) as ITU Council President.

The exhibition was highly appreciated by ITU Secretary-General,

Dr. Hamadoun I. Touré, who invited us to a short personal meeting. During the talk, we introduced our dream to create a public-private dialogue platform in Romania.

Dr. Touré reflected on it and considered it a real priority, appreciating the excellence of the Romanian IT sector. We were granted a full ITU support and consulting in organizing the 1st congress, which took place just three months later! Thanks to Dr. Touré, the dream became TRUE!

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




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
CYBERSECURITY IN ROMANIA CONFERENCE

(0 : awful; 8 : very good; 9-10 : almost perfect)




Would you like a specialist's only pre- or post-conference day in 2015?

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The concept



I. Equity, neutrality, objectivity through international and national dialogue

The **ITU** and the **Swiss Embassy in Romania** decided to support the organization of the congress, by a strong presence of their specialized directions and by ensuring neutral and non-marketing debates strengthened by the presence of internationally renowned independent specialists.

The precious help of the **Sibiu County Council** as well as the **University of Sibiu** will ensure the presence of Romanian renowned academic and research specialists who do not belong to any private firm.

Therefore, in collaboration with the **ITU** and the **CERT-RO**, joined for 2015 by the **SRI** (Romanian Intelligence Services, CYBERINT dpt.) and the **IGPR** (General Inspectorate of the Romanian Police, Cyberpolice Unit within the Dpt. of Countering Organized Crime) a selected panel of more **than 10 foreign and 20 Romanian prominent officials** in the field will attend the event and will help create the most useful dialogue between state, IT security actors and IT consumers.

II. Macro-regional points of view, from the main neighboring countries
