



Joaquín Castellón joined the Spanish National Security Department, attached to the Prime Minister Office, at the time of its creation in the summer of 2012, where nowadays he holds the position of Operational Director.

During this time, he has coordinated the Technical Commission that drafted the 2013 National Security Strategy and the drafting of the National Cyber Security Strategy, the National Maritime Security Strategy and Energy National Security Strategy.

He is also member of the National Cyber Security Council and member of the National Maritime Security Council. He has participated in the elaboration of the "National Cybersecurity Plan" and the subsequent Actions plans. He is currently member of the Management Board of the European Network and Information Security Agency (ENISA). Furthermore, he is part of the working group responsible for national transposition of the EU Network and Information Security Directive (NIS Directive).

He has additionally coordinated the Technical Commission responsible for drafting the National Security Law enacted in 2015.

He is commander at Spanish Navy, and among others, he has been assigned to aboard Fleet units, the Navy Staff, the Ministry of Defense and the Spanish Institute for Strategic Studies.
