The 11th International Conference "Keeping Children and Young People Safe Online" took place on 19-20 September 2017 in Warsaw, Poland. The was jointly organised by the Polish and German Safer Internet Centres (SICs). The co-organiser of the conference, for third time, was the International Telecommunication Union (ITU).

Experts from all over Europe gathered to discuss both the biggest safety threats on the internet as well as the latest trends and possibilities for using new technologies by children and young people.

Last year's conference programme included, among others, issues relating to fake news, the Internet of Toys, online aggression, pornography and sexting. The agenda of the event also covered topics linked to positive online content for children and youth. Moreover, the conference provided an opportunity to learn about the results of the latest studies concerning online safety.

The event is mainly addressed to representatives of the education sector, NGOs, law enforcement agencies, and internet service and content providers.
