ICT ACCESSIBILITY POLICIES AND STRATEGIES

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MONTENEGRO, QUICK FACTS

- Total surface of 13,812 sq km
- o Population: 620,029, Households: 192,242 (2011 Census)
- Republican form of government
 - 24 Municipalities
 - (The capital: Podgorica)
 - (The old Royal Capital: Cetinje)
- Average number of household members: 3.2
 - Population density (per sq km): 44.9
- 11% of the total population has difficulties in performing daily activities (chronic disease, disability or old age).
- 5% of the Montenegrin population has difficulties with mobility, 2% with vision, and 1% of persons have hearing difficulties.

 - Local public broadcasters (14 radio and 3 TV)
 - 15 commercial TV broadcasters (3 with national DTT coverage)
 - 39 FM broadcasters (5 with national coverage)
 - 2 non-profit FM radio broadcasters (local and regional)
 - Free-to-air DTT available to 92% of population (5TVs and 2 PBS radio programmes)
 - Only about 5% of households use FTA DTT
 - 95 % of households use one of distribution platform (IPTV, DTH, MMDS, CATV-CDS)
- EC sector/broadband (Source EKIP <u>www.ekip.me</u>)
 - The total number of broadband connections: 172,891
 - Access speed in range 30-50 Mbps
 - FTTH/B, VDSL, ADSL, HFC

ACCESSIBILITY IN THE BROADCASTING

- Only few broadcasters provide minimum possibilities and dedicated programmes for persons with disabilities
 - PBS: first daily news with the support for deaf people (Deaf sign language)
 - Public service broadcasting digitalisation
- Programmes dedicated to persons with disabilities
 - Programmes of national and local PBs
- The Fund for Support Commercial Radio Broadcasters

ACTIONS ON ACCESSIBILITY

- The AEM activities
 - to improve the accessibility of contents and their availability
 - to increase the number of contents dealing with issues of importance for the person with disabilities
 - very good cooperation and communication with many organizations and institutions dealing with issues of importance for Persons with Disabilities in Montenegro
 - The analyses of accessibility and contents dedicated to persons with disabilities in the programmes of Montenegrin broadcasters
 - lack of the accessible content in the programmes broadcast
 - the Montenegrin broadcasters did not recognise the existing technological possibilities as a tool to increase accessible contents
 - Workshop: "Securing Accessibility of ICT/e-Accessibility WEB and TV/Video

FUTURE PERSPECTIVES

- o DTT
 - Technological possibilities to produce accessible content
- DAB+
 - New radio contents fully devoted to persons with disabilities
 - Promotion of social inclusion and integration
 - New jobs
- o PBS
- New AVM Law
 - Audiovisual Media Service Directive Directive (EU) 2018/1808
 - Article 7 of the Directive
 - The services and programmes provided by broadcasters, and other service providers, should be made continuously and progressively accessible
 - Creation of accessibility action plans by service providers and their notification to the regulatory authority
 - emergency information, public communications and announcements in the event of natural disaster

CONCLUSION

- Legislation in Montenegro, current strategies and institutions have recognised the necessity to significantly increase the amount of accessible content in the electronic media programmes
- We are still facing a significant lack of accessible programmes both in terms of quantity and diversity
- We will continue with actions and initiatives in order to promote significance of accessible contents in programmes, and we will try to involve all stakeholders
