



Helpline: Nummer gegen Kummer

- Helplines services that are easily accessible (free of charge, confidential/anonymous) are a key element of keeping young people safe online.
- Whenever something goes wrong, helplines are there to listen and to support in finding a suitable solution for the individual situation – this helps to prevent further harm.
- **Helpline data** show that cyberbullying is the issue which helplines are dealing with most often (Insafe data April-June 2019):

Cyberbullying 16,6%

Potentially harmful content 9,7%


Love/relationships/sexuality online 9,6%

Advice for Parents Helpline "Parents Telephone"

Nr. 1 Reason for calls: excessive use followed by "to navigate through their kids' online life" and "good sources of information"

How to submit your complaint

Please find below illustrations on important web services about which you may file complaints.

What happens to my complaint?

When you submit a complaint to the "Internet-Beschwerdestelle.de", it is judicially examined at first. If the reported content violates relevant Youth Protection or Criminal law, the operators of "internet-beschwerdestelle.de" can initiate further steps to remove the content:

Content providers are directly contacted and requested to adjust the reported content. Alternatively, the hosting provider can be asked to remove the subject matter. In serious cases, the complaint can be anonymized and forwarded to the appropriate public agency.

The World Wide Web is the most famous internet service. You have access to about 4 billion individual web sites via the www. These sites can be accessed through their addresses (URL=uniform resource locator).
