- □ Versatile legal environment not only for personal data protection in the EU but also outside Europe;
- □ Personal data protection rules fit for innovation: the GDPR is technology neutral;

#### Technologies and GDPR

- ☐ Core principle of transparency;
- □ Concise, transparent, intelligible and easily accessible information;
- When new technologies are being developed consent is nonapplicable mainly because initially deep learning needs information for a long time.



#### Technologies and GDPR

- □ Lawfulness, fairness, transparency, purpose and storage limitation, data minimisation, accuracy, integrity and confidentiality as well as accountability;
- ☐ Decision of the European Court of Human Rights on Breyer v. Germany case.

- Principles "data protection by design" and "data protection by default";
- □ Technologies should serve mankind without making us dependent;
- □ In addition to the efficiency of technology, public awareness of the benefits of this technology is needed.
