EU legal background

Article 28 EECC

 Obligation for MS to cooperate and solve issues in relation to cross-border coordination for harmonised bands

"any Member State concerned may request the Radio Spectrum Policy Group to use its good offices to address any problem or dispute in relation to cross-border coordination or cross border harmful interference"

 The Commission may adopt decisions to implement a coordinated solution proposed in an RSPG opinion for harmonised bands

Example of actions

- Recommending the process for ensuring 700 MHz availability:
 - Need to rebuild consistent rights <694 MHz & Broadcasting/mobile cross-border is problematic

- Multilateral groups for « cluster » : WEDDIP, NEDDIF, SEDDIF, BSDDIF, Adriatic …
- Roadmap/deadline to reach agreements <u>before</u>
 implementation of DD2
- Longstanding broadcasting interference around Italy : solved for UHF, in progress for VHF, still difficult for FM
- New activity to address the coordination issues in the 3.4-3.8 GHz including synchronization

700 MHz band

- Questionnaire & actions for ensuring the availability. Decision (EU) 2017/899 deadlines:
 - Concluding cross-border agreements before 31/12/2017
 - Publishing roadmap before 30/06/2018
 - Authorization before 30/06/2020 (except ...)
 - Start/end of migration with transitionnal impact
- Addressing intra-EU difficulties

 Identifying issues with countries outside EU and assisting EC

RADIO SPECTRUM POLICY GROUP 700 MHz band – where we are

- ✓ Concluding cross-border agreements: fully reached in time!
- Publishing roadmap: last roadmap published recently (due to cross-border transition issue)
- ✓ Authorization: normally only 3 MS >2020, but Covid-19 uncertainty

EU borders

- The main issue remains timing uncertainty (decision/transition delay) at the eastern side.
- Practical solutions for Balkans, Cyprus, North Africa.

Cross-border coordination in the 3.4-3.8 GHz band

5G TDD in 3.4-3.8 GHz means **BS to BS interference** over large distance

- Synchronization?
- Same frame structure?

Questionnaire for identifying issues for fixed/mobile (MFCN):

- Legacy use (eg. WiMax)
- Cross-border agreements: threshold for BS-BS interference? synchronisation? Process in case of interference?

Other services in particular at the EU border (eg, earth stations)?
