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TITLE: Mastering fundamentals of the Fifth-generation collaborative regulation / General introduction of G5 regulation and its related tools

DESCRIPTION OF ACTION:

Communications Regulatory Agency (CRA) Bosnia and Herzegovina pledges to develop, improve and implement a regulatory framework that provides incentives and opportunities for investments in high-capacity broadband infrastructures, to promote competition and to ensure affordable and secure access to high-quality communication networks and services available, accessible and affordable for all. Furthermore, following global trends, CRA monitors the development of digital economy with the aim of addressing new regulatory challenges stemming from fast-evolving digital technologies. To that end, CRA closely follows the legal initiatives by the European Union regarding digital markets, in order to adjust itself to the digital era. CRA recognise the potential of digital technologies for improving society and economy and would like to take a proactive stance so that citizens and industry can benefit from digital transformation.

Bosnia and Herzegovina hence aims to align its regulatory framework with current approaches adopted by the EU and recommended by ITU. Specifically, mastering fundamentals of Fifth-generation collaborative regulation (G5 regulation), as an ITU concept of continual technological development, appeared to be indispensable.

In order to get insight into collaborative regulation policies and best practice, CRA applied for ITU assistance, proposing an organisation of Digital Regulation Training Programs. Aim of the project is to





enable transfer of knowledge on G5 regulation, that would empower CRA to adopt successive concept evolving from command-and-control public monopolies to collaborative regulation across institutions and stakeholders as part of a digital economy.

Training programs are expected to enable CRA to understand the evolution of regulation, to assess actual regulatory state of play in Bosnia and Herzegovina and to adopt necessary steps to enable a successful transition to G5 regulation.

COUNTRIES in FOCUS:

Apart from engagement of ITU experts, exchange of experience with some regulatory bodies from EU countries that might have similar administrative organisation would be useful.
