The seventh **World Telecommunication Development Conference** (WTDC-17) considered the **latest trends** in telecommunication/information and communication technology (ICT) development and established the **priorities** of the ITU Telecommunication Development Sector (ITU-D) for the interval between two WTDCs.

WTDC-17 established 2 Study Groups in ITU Development Sector and assigned 7 hot topics (Questions) to each Study Group. The assigned topics have practical importance for the development of ICTs, and ITU membership expects timely, in-depth, concise, focused, and forward-looking reports.





ITU-D study groups provide an opportunity for the membership to share experiences, present ideas, exchange views, and achieve consensus on strategies to address telecommunication/ICT priorities.

Key deliverables:

Reports, Guidelines and annual thematic Papers (annual deliverables) based on inputs through contributions, case studies and surveys, which are made available to the membership through online platforms in all UN languages. Main services:

- Information exchange (contribution-driven and multi-stakeholder for members by members);
- **Capacity building mechanism** (thematic expert meetings and workshops online, in headquarters and in the regions);
- *Knowledge platform* (repository of case studies, lessons learned, best practices and reports)
- **Expert exchange** (engaging communities of experts on thematics of interest for implementation and for facilitating partnerships and collaboration).


