

GC Resolution

Resolves to:

reaffirm its commitment to the establishment of a Regional Regulatory Body (RRB) for Telecommunications and ICT in CARICOM,

- a. the RRB to comprise representatives from telecommunications and ICT regulators from CARICOM Member States
- b. the RRB to serve as a platform for fostering regulatory harmonization through collaboration, consensus building, capacity development, and knowledge sharing, consistent with international best practices
- c. the RRB shall not have direct regulatory powers but shall focus on facilitating cooperation among regulators, policymakers, and stakeholders to encourage a harmonized approach to telecommunications and ICT regulation within the region
- d. the RRB to be established initially with administrative and technical support from an existing organization with expertise in telecommunications, ICT, and regulation; CTU, ECTEL, OOCUR, etc.
- e. the governance framework of the RRB shall be based on good governance and regulatory principles, and its structures and funding shall be formulated with input from Caribbean regulators to ensure buy-in, relevance, and alignment with the needs of participating countries





Digital Regulation for Innovation, Inclusion and Resilience


- The Americas region is transforming through digitalization but innovation must be inclusive, secure, and sustainable.

- The Digital Regulation Network (DRN) provides a space for collaboration, knowledge sharing, and policy harmonization.
