In the case of Costa Rica, there is a law called Guidelines on Visas in which it is established, by country, the type of visa you should apply for. Besides reviewing the visa requirements to visit Costa Rica, delegates must meet the following requirements:

- Trip Ticket continuity or return to the country of origin.
- Proof of economic solvency, which corresponds to \$ 100.00 per month for tourism.
- Passport in good condition. The minimum term of passports according to the group in which the foreign person is located, according to the Guideline to Join Costa Rica :
 - \checkmark For nationals located in the First Group, up to 1 day.
 - ✓ For nationals located in the Second Group, mandatory term of 3 months.
 - ✓ For the national Third and Fourth Group, mandatory term of 6 months.
