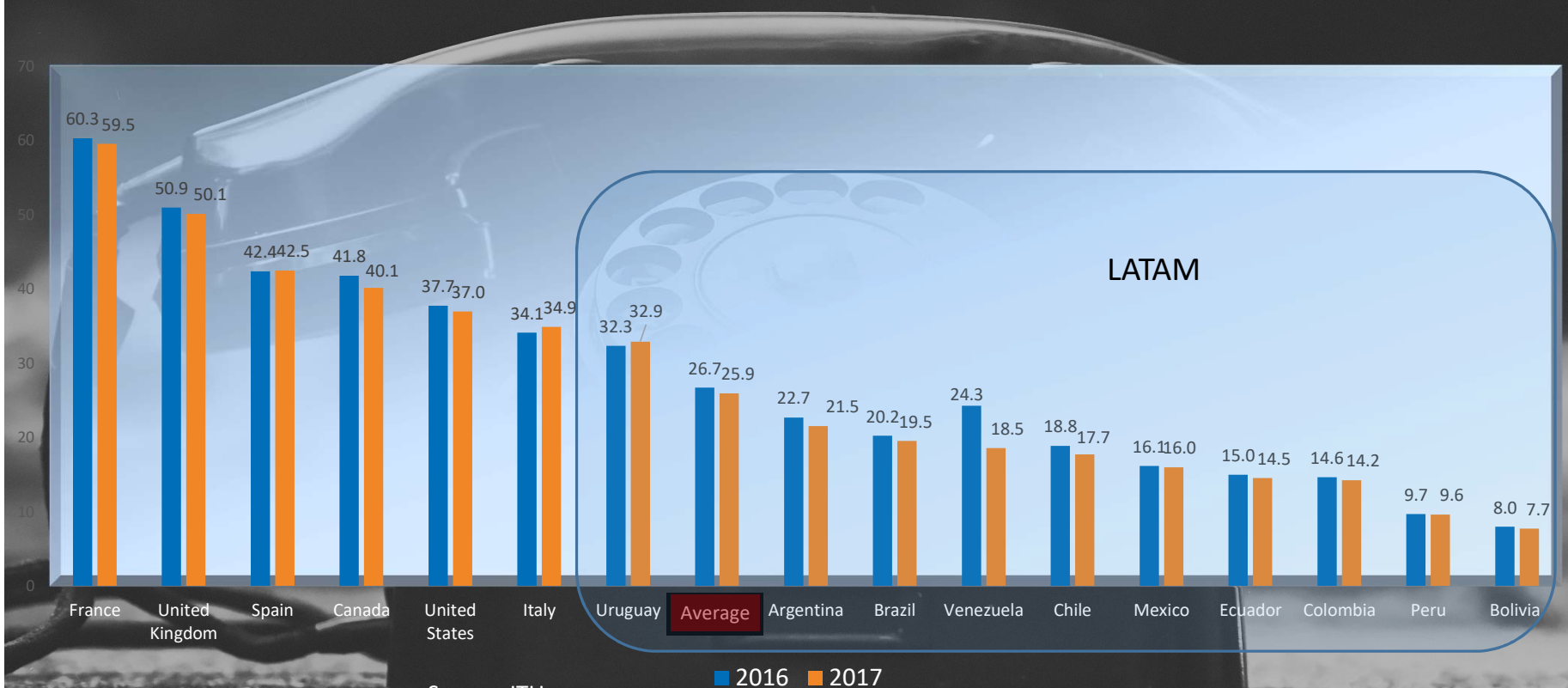

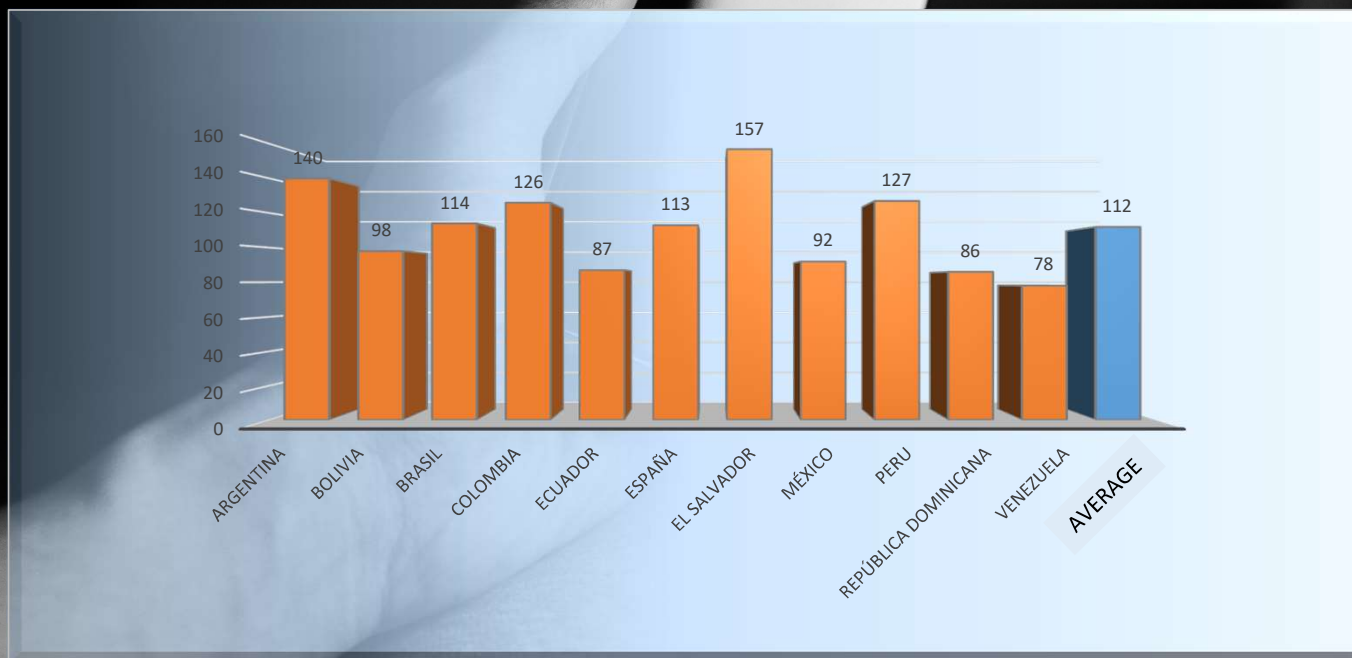


Fixed Telephony Density

The average of fixed lines per 100 inhabitants is 25.9 for the total sample of countries and 16 for Latin American countries.



Mobile Telephony Density



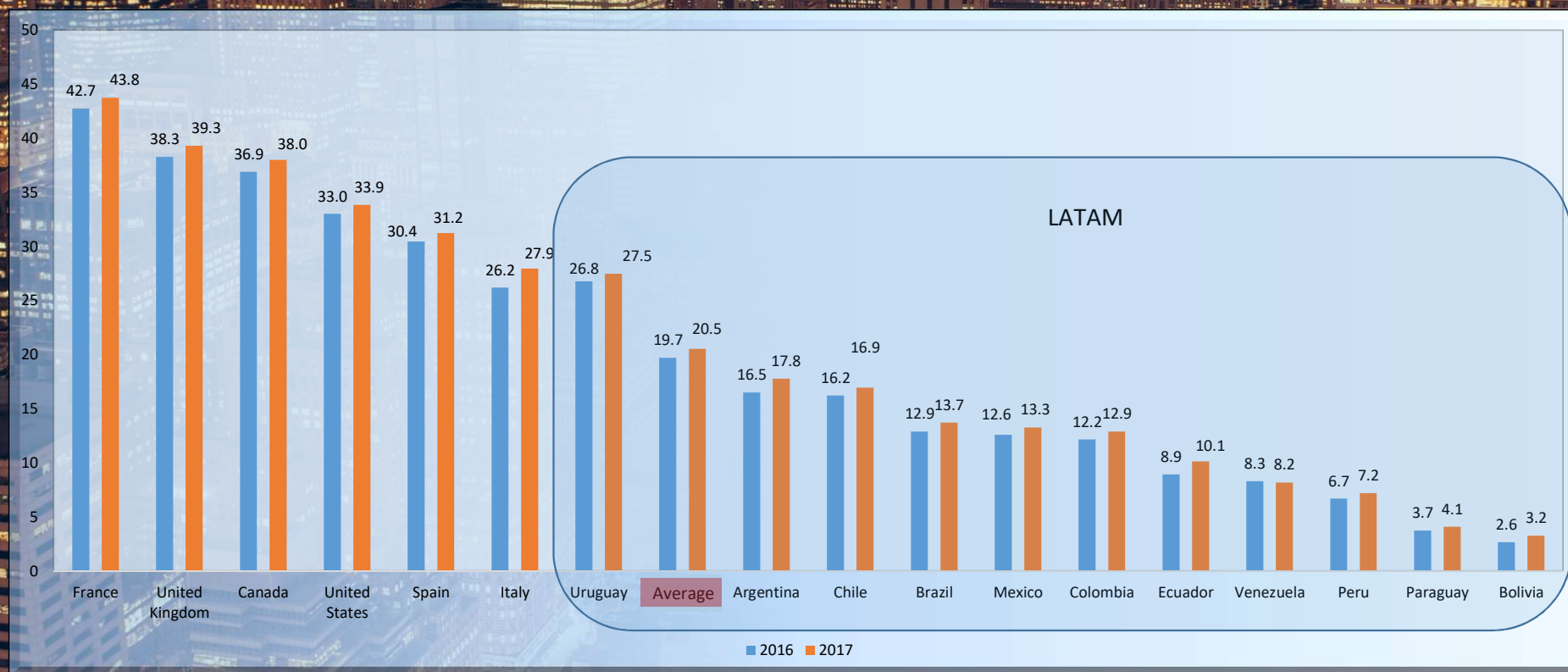

The average density is 20 subscribers per 100 inhabitants. The average for Latin American countries is 12.

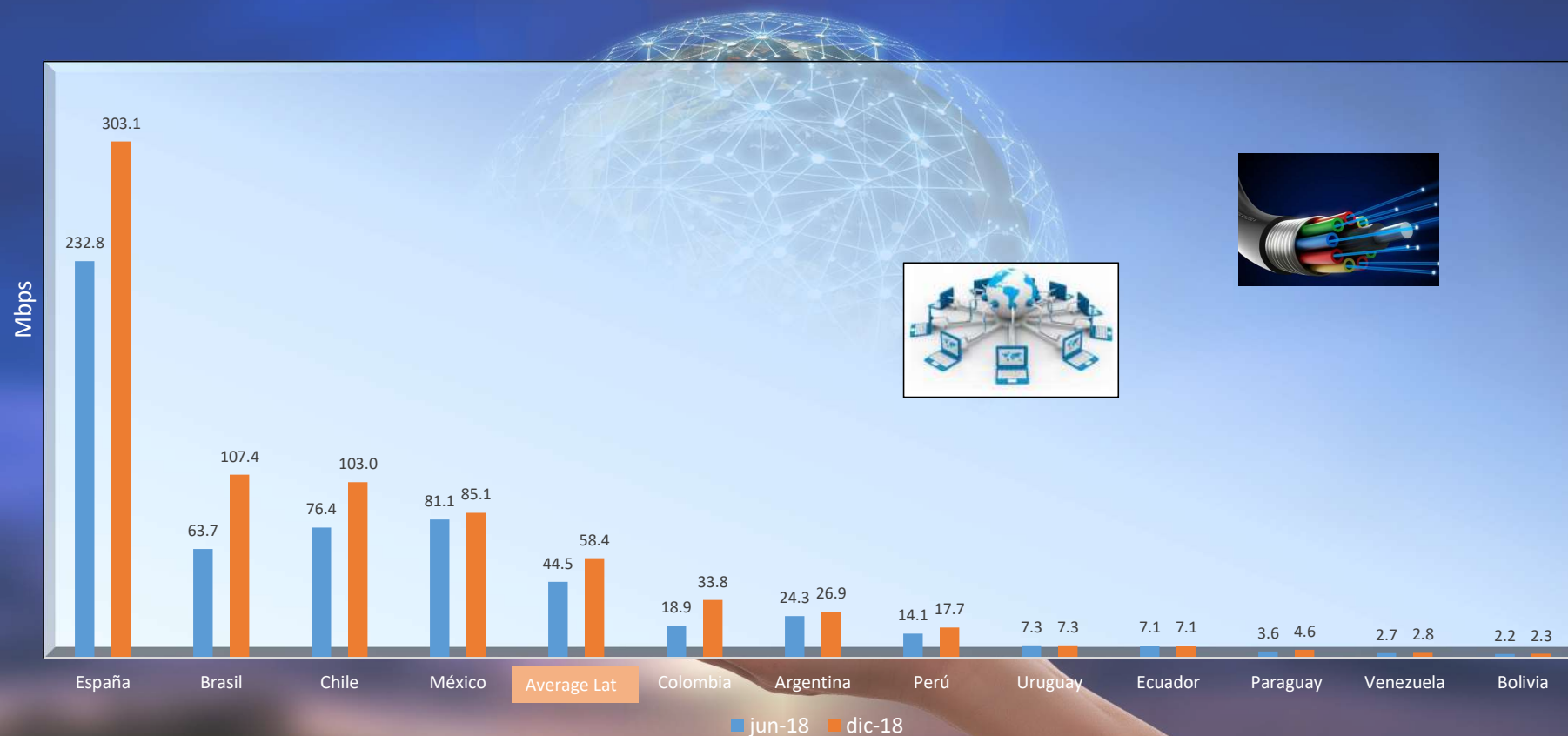

Average speed in LATAM is 58,4 Mbps.

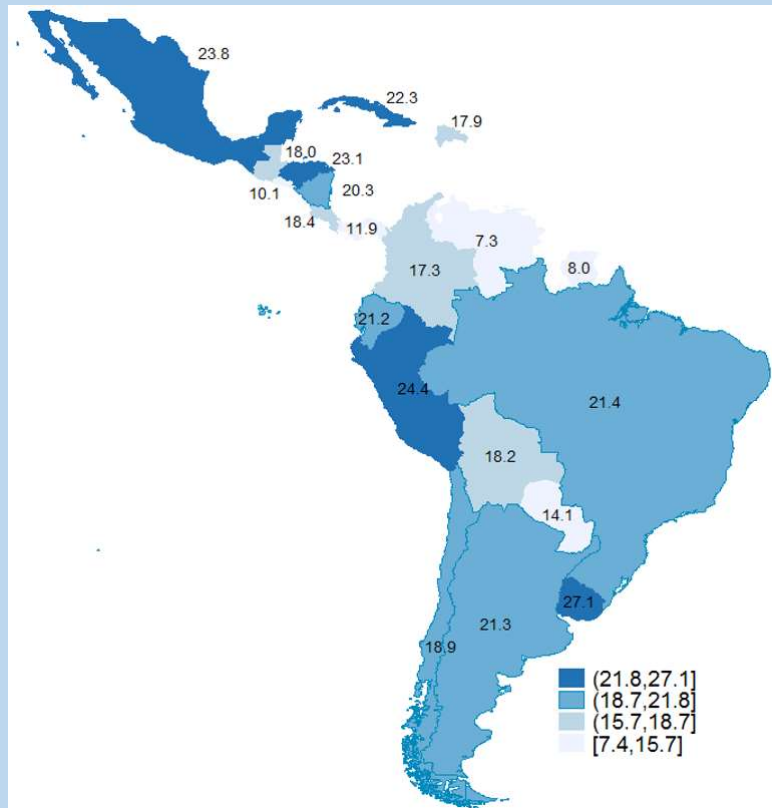

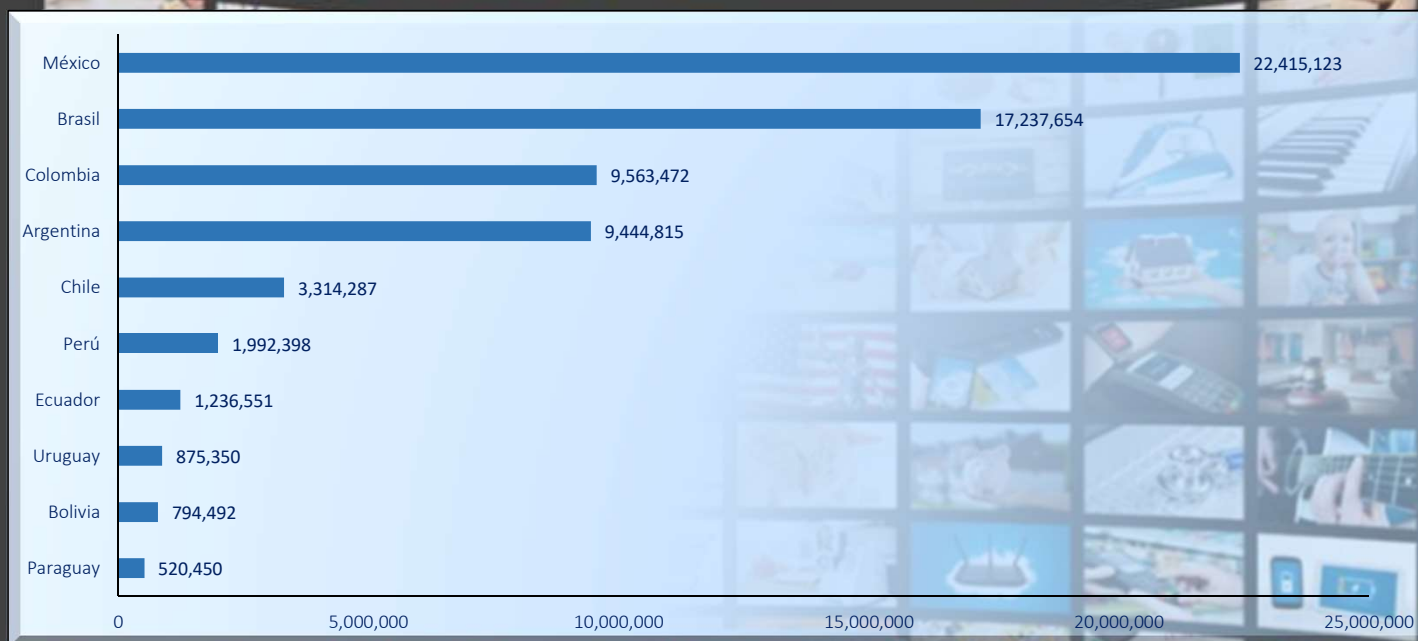

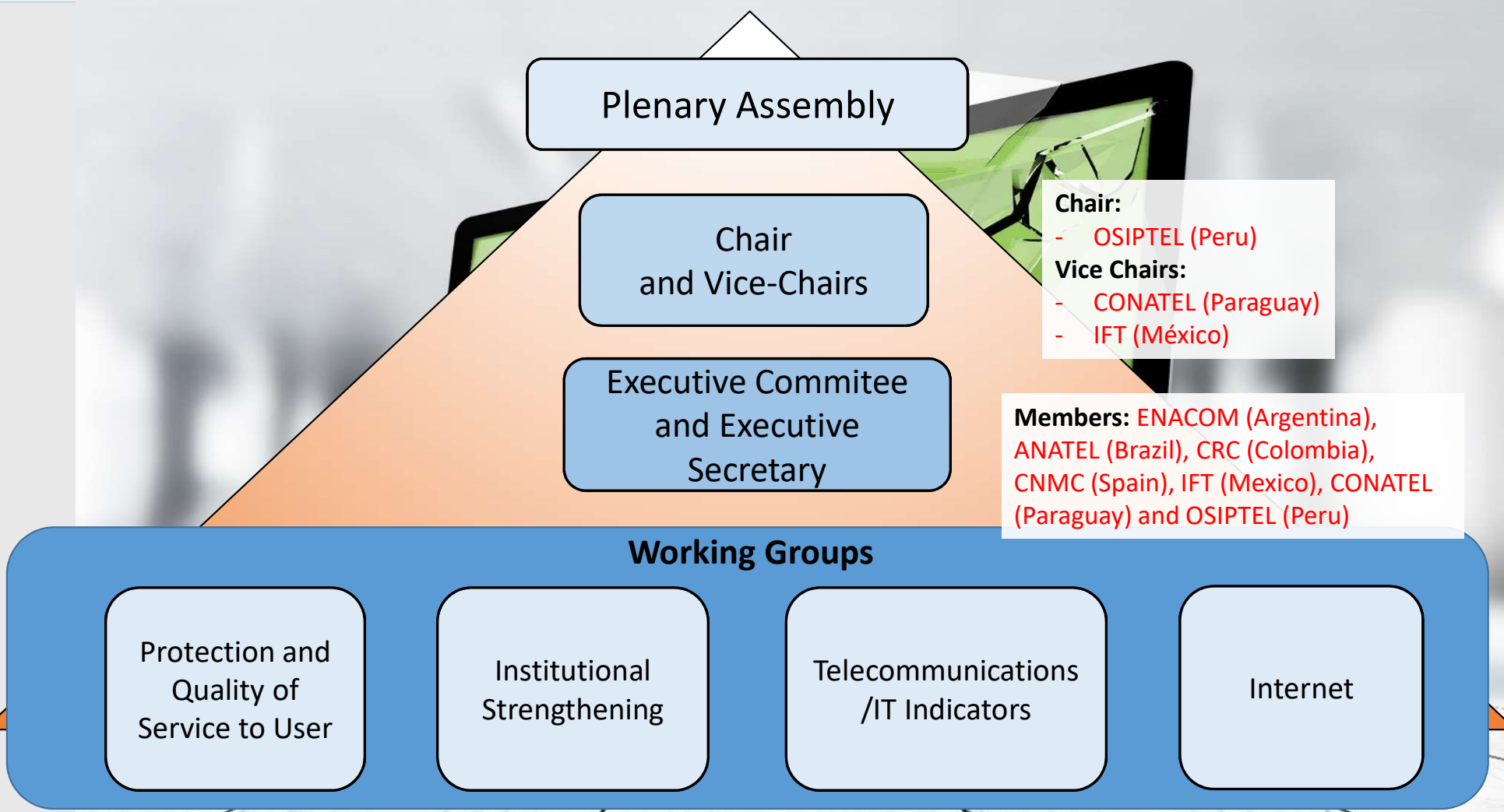

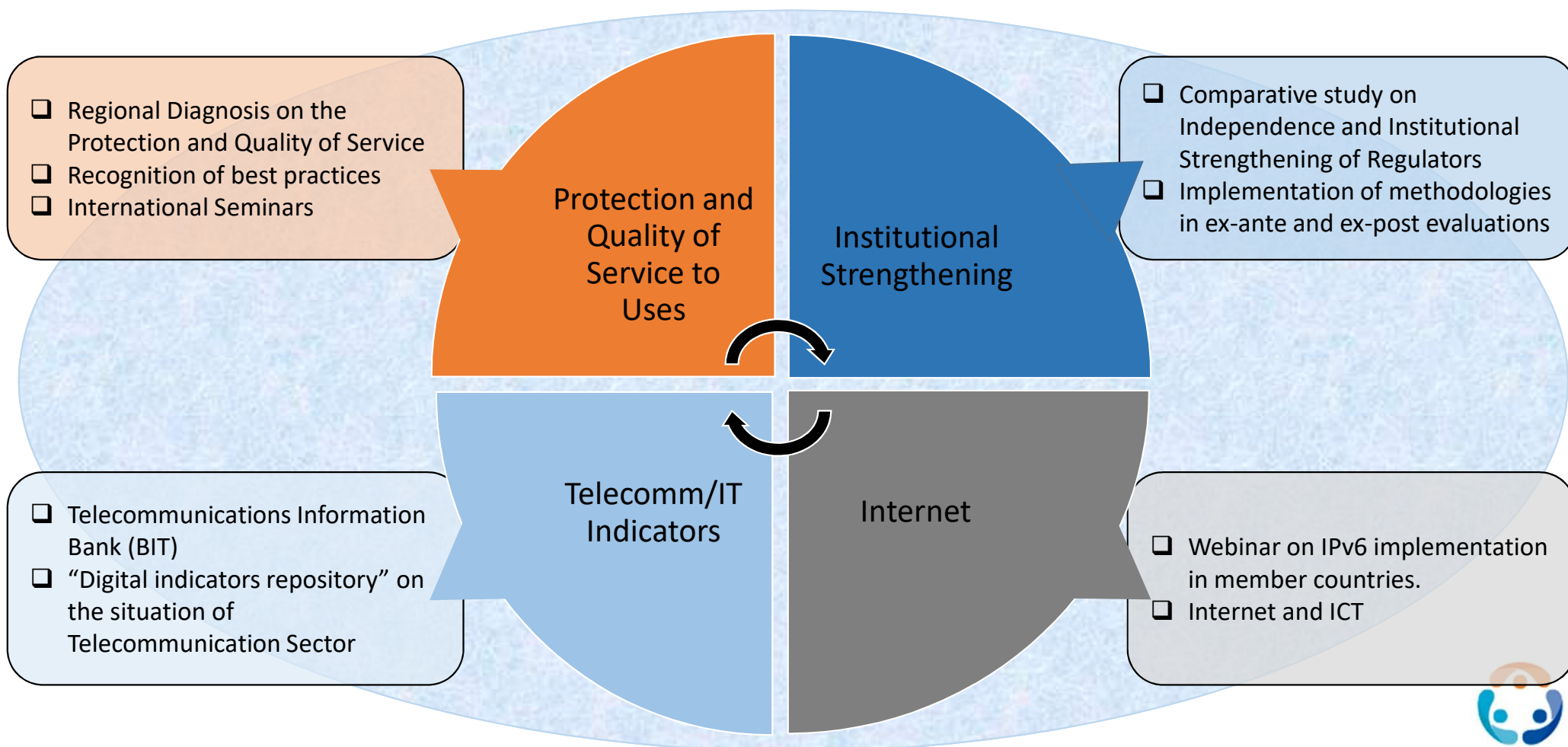
REGULATEL Structure

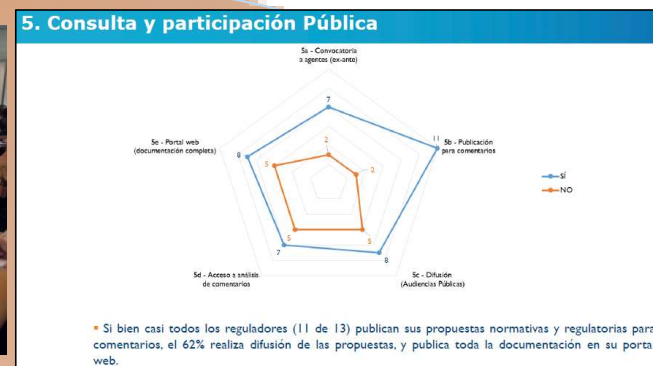

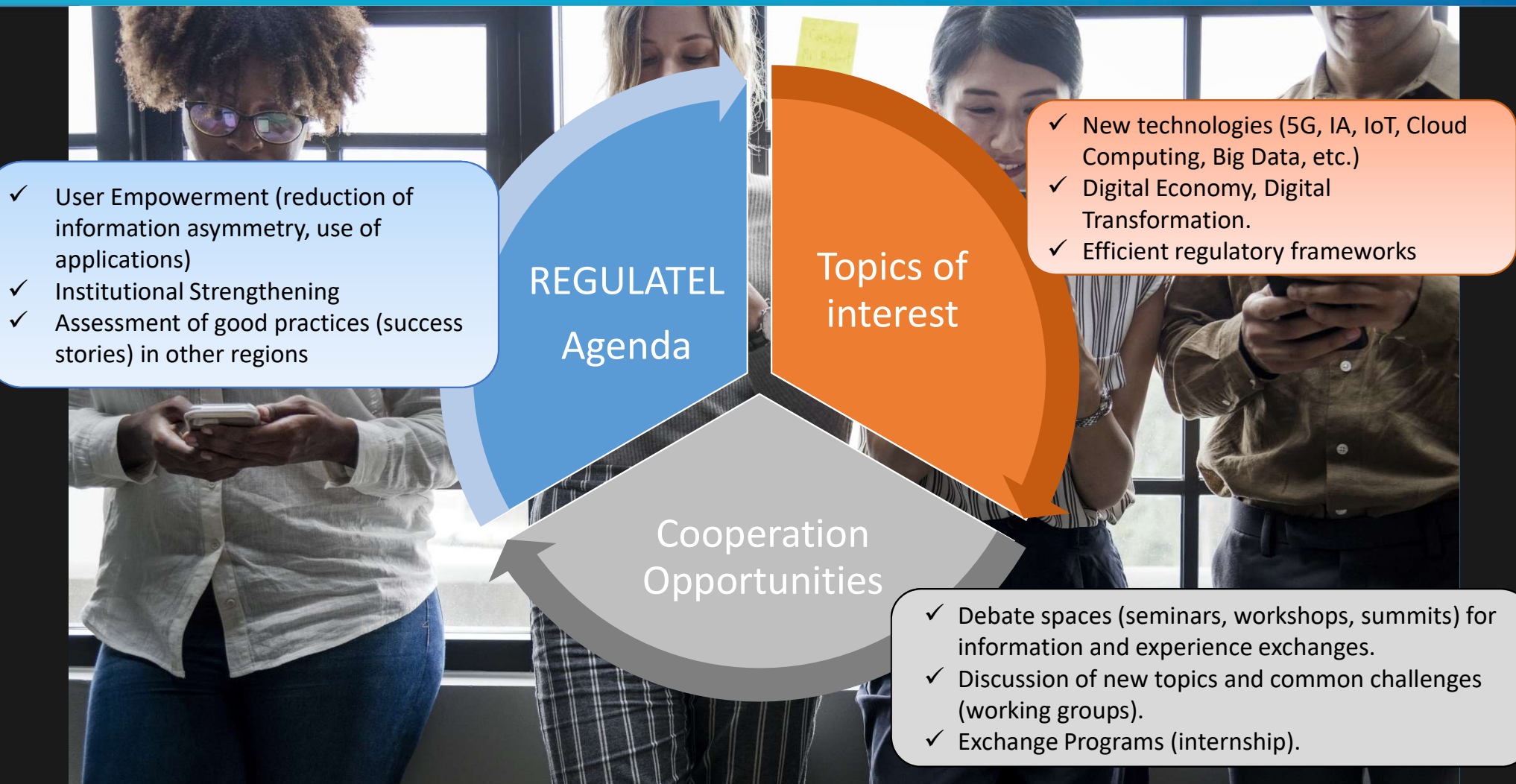
