Mr Paul Margie is the U.S. Representative of Télécoms sans Frontières and a partner with the law firm of Harris, Wiltshire & Grannis LLP. Previously, Paul was Senior Director for Technology Partnerships at the United Nations Foundation where he directed a worldwide partnership with the Vodafone Group Foundation to use wireless technologies to improve healthcare and emergency response. Prior to this position, Paul was Legal Advisor to U.S. Federal Communications Commissioner Michael J. Copps, and Legislative Counsel and then Senior Commerce Counsel for U.S. Senator John D. Rockefeller IV. Before joining Senator Rockefeller's staff, he was an attorney at a Washington, D.C. law firm.

Paul is a member of the U.S. Department of State's Advisory Committee on International Communications and Information Policy (ACICP), and serves on its Sub-Committee on International Disaster Response. He is also a member of the Board of Directors of MapAction USA. Previously, he served as Co-Chair of the Advisory Committee for the 2012 World Radiocommunication Conference, Member of the International Telecommunications Satellite Organization (ITSO) Panel of Legal Experts, and Adjunct Professor at the Georgetown University Law Center teaching communications law (2002-2012). He has deployed with Télécoms sans Frontières to emergencies in Haiti, the Philippines, and Nepal.

Paul received his law degree from the University of Chicago, with honors. He was the Editor-in-Chief of the University of Chicago Legal Forum. Mr. Margie received a B.A. from Haverford College, with honors.
