# DIGITAL TRANSFORMATION CENTERS FOR DIGITAL SKILLS TO ATTAIN MEANINGFUL CONNECTIVITY



#### **PROJECT OVERVIEW**

In 2019, ITU in partnership with **Cisco launched the Digital** Transformation Centres (DTC) Initiative with the high-level goal of supporting countries in developing digital skills, mainly at the basic and intermediate levels and particularly in underserved communities. A core objective of this Initiative is to support countries to strengthen digital capacities of citizens, particularly in the underserved communities. ITU and Cisco are at the forefront of the initiative but have worked in collaboration with many partners in both the private and public sectors. In 2020, the Government of Norway and ITU engaged in a partnership to support the implementation of the DTC Initiative through providing financial support to the project "Boosting digital skills through DTCs". A pronounced focus of this project is to support and scale the activities of the DTC in Ghana.

# **DTC INITIATIVE (DTCI)**

- The DTCI has grown to 13 DTCs across 4 regions

 3 virtual meetings have been organized to bring DTCs together to share learning experiences, strengthening the DTCI network

### SUPPORT TO DTCS GLOBALLY

- The DTCs in Rwanda and Zambia have conducted training of trainers
- The DTC in Zambia will conduct a stakeholder engagement workshop in 2023
- The DTC in Côte d'Ivoire, Dominican Republic and Indonesia will be delivering training of trainers workshops in 2023

# **DTC IN GHANA**

- GIFEC has trained 10,446 citizens, including 7,593 women, in basic and intermediate digital skills
- 196 Master trainers, including 10 women, were trained
- 101 Community Centres have been equipped with modems and internet routers and assisted with training supplies
- 16 coding clubs have been established and are fully functional

# WHAT'S NEXT?

The DTC in Ghana will continue to provide training opportunities to underserved communities across Ghana with basic and intermediate digital skills. Additionally, the DTC in Ghana will continue to run coding clubs for school aged children. ITU will continue to support DTCs. ITU has just begun to adapt existing training content to meet the training needs of the citizens DTCs are reaching. Partnerships are at the heart of the DTCI, and ITU is continuing its efforts to create partnerships to strengthen the Initiative on global and local levels. Partnership development is being followed at the level of each DTC with support from ITU to find areas of collaboration that individual DTCs can pursue with partners. This work is ongoing,

#### LESSONS LEARNED

# ADAPTABILITY

By working in partnership with local partners and stakeholders, the work of the DTCs can be strengthened, ensuring at the same time the long-term sustainability of the Initiative long after this project. These partnerships will support DTCs to continue to reach underserved communities.

# CREATIVITY

In this project, DTCs had to creatively address challenges in both face-to-face and remote training environments. DTCs used internationally recognized content and applied creative solutions to ensure that content was accessible, for all participants. This included adapting training to provide multilingual instruction.

# **COLLABORATION**

DTCs are organizations and institutions with an existing network of training centres and with diverse and abundant experience and expertise. Collaboration between DTCs and the private sector, as well as collaboration between the DTCs, have proven integral for the sustainability of this project and the continual learning process.
