

Assessment study on C&I for Maghreb



ITU organized the Workshop for Maghreb Region to promote the Development and Implementation of Conformance and Interoperability Programmes, from 9 to 11 December 2014, on Tunis (Tunisia), in collaboration with the Union de Maghreb Arab (UMA) and the Centre d'Etudes et de Recherche des Télécommunications Lab (CERT).



Assessment study on C&I for Maghreb



The workshop, based on the results and recommendations from the assessment study on Conformity and Interoperability conducted for Maghreb countries, aimed to identify all the necessary elements and promote the Collaboration among Regional and Subregional Organizations for establishing a common Conformity and Interoperability Programmes and Mutual Recognition Agreements (MRA).

The workshop was attended by representatives of communication administrations, telecommunication regulators and telecommunication service providers, from Tunisia, Mauritania, Morocco, Algeria, Gabon, KSA, Cameroon, UMA and the ITU. Total number of participants made 30.

The workshop recommends that UMA forms a C&I Committee to be chaired by the UMA Secretariat to undertake the following tasks:

Ways Forward



1. Develop a Plan for the establishment of Maghreb In-Country C&I Testing Laboratories. This plan shall include the criteria to determine the locations and the testing scopes of these in-country C&I testing laboratories

Ways Forward



Develop a Plan for the establishment of Regional C&I Testing Laboratories. This plan shall include the criteria to determine the numbers, locations and testing scopes of these Regional C&I Testing Laboratories.

Ways Forward



3. Develop a Plan for the Establishment of a Maghreb MRA Framework similar to the MRA already signed between countries in other regions (ex: Asia Pacific Economic Cooperation Mutual Recognition Arrangement for Conformity Assessment of Telecommunications Equipment (APEC TEL MRA)) covering 21 economies in the Asia Pacific region. This plan shall preferably include the creation of a small Maghreb MRA Task Force which can adapt the MRA models already used, to meet specific requirements of the Maghreb Region. In implementing the Maghreb MRA, Members States shall become signatories to this multilateral arrangement in the Maghreb Region Participation in the Maghreb MRA is voluntary..

The First meeting of Maghreb C&I Expert Committee will be held in Rabat (Morocco), 23-25 November 2015. The meeting will be devoted mainly to reviewing the results of the evaluation study of the current regimes governing the Conformance and interoperability testing in the Maghreb countries and to the review/approval of the draft Mutual Recognition Agreement (MRA) between the Arab Maghreb countries as suggested by the International Telecommunications Union.
