- Arrival/Departure:
 - From Airport to Meeting Venue:
You can either arrive via taxi or public transportation, please check out at <https://www.hkstp.org/find-us/>.
Daily shuttle bus will be available between hotel and the meeting venue.
 - From Airport to Hotel Venue:
Via Taxi (Recommended): Cash ONLY, ~400 HKD.
Via Bus: Take A41P bus outside Terminal 1, and exit at Shek Mun BBI, and a ~200 meter walk to arrive the hotel.
 - From High-speed train station (West Kowloon) & Various Shenzhen board to Hotel Venue
It is recommended to take the Tuen Ma Line to arrive Shek Mun Station, and a ~400 meter walk to arrive the hotel.
- Emergency Numbers
The phone 999 serves for local police, ambulance service and fire department and other emergencies.
- Currency & Exchange:
Local currency is Hong Kong Dollars (HKD). There are currency exchange counters at the Airport and quite many in the street as well.
ATMs: Travellers who carry internationally recognized ATM/Credit cards can obtain cash in HKD at ATMs installed at airports, major hotels, department stores, tourist attractions and outside banks.
