The \$1 trillion war against scams: a global issue, voice & SMS key





- Scams deeply impact the global economy up to 4% of the GDP in some countries
- Scammers operate as of organized crime, acting from anywhere to anywhere. They
 operate globally, when we (telecom service providers, banks, law enforcement...)
 operate mostly locally, in multiple jurisdictions and frameworks
- Beyond remarkable national initiatives and regional cooperation, the telecoms ecosystem must contribute to **global alignment and cooperation**, prevention, traceability, and information sharing






The telecoms ecosystem contribution: Restore Trust initiative

One Consortium: international communications industry

- One Consortium, the industry pillar of the Restore Trust initiative, launched on March 15th, 2024
- inclusive, not-for-profit, members driven, members funded
- 50+ members: traffic carrying companies (carriers, service providers, CPaaS, global platforms...), vendors, industry organizations: GSMA, i3Forum, ATIS, ITG, CCA, CCUK...
- initial objectives, working with telecom National Regulatory Authorities (NRAs) :
 - 1) co-develop global guidance and a vendor neutral "toolbox"
 - 2) drive adoption in the industry
 - 3) build an industry-wide self-governance to drive compliance
- unique in several ways:
 - purpose built to address a global societal issue from the perspective of the international telecoms industry
 - 2) purpose built to co-develop solutions with regulators, globally (GIRAF)
 - participation from major industry associations: leverage existing work, prevent duplication, boost awareness and adoption

the industry's contribution to restoring trust in calls and messages.

New working group on

Working groups: focused & quick paced!

- working group #1: Survey of Industry Landscape (tools and best practices)
 - compile a survey of generic industry tools and best practices
 - linking with survey of regulatory initiatives (WG2)
 - Deliverable: finalizing a **report** summarizing the tools and best practices (November)
- working group #2: International Survey of Regulatory Initiatives
 - completed initial round of survey regulations and industry initiatives (77 countries) Phase 1
 - Deliverable: Finalizing an initial **report** summarizing the regulations and industry initiatives (November)
- working group #3: International Traceback
 - Deliverable: a "non paper" on International Traceback, jointly with GIRAF (end of year) as a recommendation for an Industry Led International Traceback Process
- working group #4: Illegitimate Spoofing
 - identify use cases for national CLIs used on international links (e.g. **roaming**, **cloud communications**)
 - Deliverable: white paper recommending best practices on roaming and cloud communications
 - Deliverable: Know Your Customer (KYC) / Know Your Traffic (KYT)
 - Right To Use (RTU)
- working group #5: Messaging
 - issue a report on messaging ecosystem and ongoing efforts to mitigate spam and scam messages.
- develop a report with regulatory and policy recommendations, and best practices

Global Informal Regulatory Antifraud Forum



GIRAF: a global informal forum for telecom regulators

- informal group of experts launched in June 2024; 39 regulatory authorities from 5 continents (fast growing), monthly plenary meetings, working groups, joint sessions with One Consortium (all virtual meetings)
- scope: unwanted/fraudulent voice & messaging initially.
- goal: foster multilateral NRA collaboration, global cooperation with the international communications industry (One Consortium) and other stakeholders
- initial objective: framework of non-binding, harmonized recommendations, best practices and guidelines
- inclusive and free: opt-in, open to all NRAs or public competent Authorities with similar regulatory responsibilities, contributing as resources and availability allow
- neutral, non-binding and independent, led by regulators : Nkom (Norway) and others
- sovereignty: individual NRAs retain full sovereignty and are free to implement GIRAF guidelines and recommendations

GIRAF: ongoing survey of participants (20 respondents to date)

- reaching out to additional NRAs globally to keep growing participation: e.g.
 Spanish speaking regulators, French speaking regulators, Pacific Islands,
 Caribbeans...
- virtual meetings held monthly since July 2024,
 - Information sharing and best practices
 - contribution driven
 - "deep dives"
 - Task Forces
- cooperation with the industry (One Consortium) and other stakeholders
 - join roadmap for global multi-stakeholder discussions, joint working groups (Traceback, Spoofing, industry & regulatory best practice, messaging)
 - Interaction with UNODC, Interpol, Google and others that want to interact


