Transversal vs. differential ethical concerns



Transversal

- Benefit-sharing
 - Which benefits and to who?
- Proportionality in rewarding added value
- Power and epistemic justice

Differential

- The initial data collection stage
 - Consent, entrustment, protection
- Cataloging stage
 - Consensus, impartiality (independence)
- Access
 - Criteria for qualification





Centralization vs. Decentralization

Decentralization

- Localized data banks and warehouses
- Strengthening existing structures and capacities
- Autonomy to ask locally relevant questions

Centralization

- Cataloging process (based on consensus and not power)
- Standardization of criteria for access

A robust infrastructure should not be narrowly finalized
Separation from immediate pragmatic ends
