With a diverse professional background spanning the public sector, business and academia, Lara has been monitoring and analyzing new technologies and their impact on telecom regulation, economics and market structure for some 20 years.

At ITU, she was previously senior policy analyst and manager of the organization's first technology foresight programme. She contributed to forums and events such as WTPF, WSIS, ITU Telecom Forum, and acted as secretary to Council and ITU Plenipotentiary PP working groups.

In 2013, Lara joined the ITU's Standardization Bureau, where she is currently Head of the Bridging the Standardization Gap Programme, and Counsellor for Economic and Policy Issues' Study Group 3 and its 5 regional groups.
