What are the standards


Recommendations are standards that define how telecommunication networks operate and interwork

Standards Developing Organization (**SDO**), is an organization whose primary activities are developing, coordinating and revising <u>technical standards</u> that are intended to address the needs of a group of affected adopters.

Standards are critical to the interoperability of ICTs and whether we exchange data messages, standards enable global communications by ensuring that countries' ICT networks and devices are speaking the same language.


Metrology, standardization and conformity assessment

Participation & Capacity Building


Bridging the standardization gap

Bridging the standardization gap requires a sequence of steps, depending on the level of:


- country economic development

Standardization Development Ladder


