INSTITUTIONAL SUPPORT

- The National Centre for Child Protection (*), under the Ministry of Social Development, is the governmental organ responsible assessing and following up children's rights together with other governmental organs. It has no specific policy on online protection.
- <u>The Telecommunications Regulatory Authority(*)</u> provides information for child online protection on its space for <u>Safe Surf</u>. It has launched a <u>Report</u> on the state of internet safety in the kingdom. It also organizes lectures in schools to help parents and teachers understand the online safety issues which affect children.
