NATIONAL LEGISLATION

- Criminal Code Sections <u>163</u>, <u>163.1</u>, <u>172.1</u>, and <u>172.2</u>.
- <u>Bill C-15A</u> "An act to amend the criminal code and to amend other acts", September 2002.
- <u>Bill C-2</u> "An act to amend the criminal code (protection of children and other vulnerable persons) and the Canada evidence act", June 2005.
- <u>Bill C-22</u> "An Act respecting the mandatory reporting of internet child pornography by persons who provide an internet service", March 2011.

NATIONAL STRATEGY

- Canadian Strategy to Promote Safe, Wise and Responsible Internet Use, February 2001.
- National Strategy to Combat Child Exploitation on the Internet, May 2004.
- <u>Canada's Cybersecurity Strategy</u> talks about criminalizing "the use of a computer system to sexually exploit a child" (p.13)

UN CONVENTION

• Signed and ratified, with no declarations or reservations to articles 16, 17(e) and 34(c), the Convention on the Rights of Child.

UN PROTOCOL

Signed and ratified, with no declarations or reservations to articles 2 and 3, the <u>Optional</u>
 <u>Protocol to The Convention on the Rights of the Child on the Sale of Children, Child Prostitution</u> and <u>Child Pornography</u>.

INSTITUTIONAL SUPPORT

- Funding provided by Public Safety Canada regarding children protection.
- Governmental Contribution Program to Combat Child Sexual Exploitation and Human Trafficking (CPCCSEHT).
- Branches within the Royal Canadian Mounted Police: National Child Exploitation Coordination
 Centre and National Missing Children Service
- The Canadian Cyber-incident Response Centre (CCIRC) is responsible for general alerts, advisories, information notes and technical reports.
