NATIONAL LEGISLATION

- [Article 96 and 116bis\(a\)](#) of the Law No. 12 of 1996 Promulgating the Child Law

NATIONAL STRATEGY

- Internet safety for young people is addressed in the [Cyber Peace Initiative](#) of the Ministry of Communications and Information Technology.
- The [National e-Safety Working Group](#) started its activities in October 2009 with the aim of activating a national strategy for protecting and empowering children online.

UN CONVENTION

- Signed and ratified, with no declarations or reservations to articles 16, 17(e) and 34(c), the [Convention on the Rights of Child](#).

UN PROTOCOL

- Acceded, with no declarations or reservations to articles 2 and 3, to the [Optional Protocol to The Convention on the Rights of the Child on the Sale of Children, Child Prostitution and Child Pornography](#).

INSTITUTIONAL SUPPORT

- The Ministry of Communications and Information Technology provides information on [Internet Safety \(*\)](#).
- The Ministry of Communications and Information Technology provides information provides training opportunities and [information \(*\)](#) for parents under its Cyber Peace Initiative.
- [TEDate \(*\)](#) was established in 2001 by [Egypt Telecom \(*\)](#) and is Egypt's largest IP based data communications vehicle. Its service is supervised by the [National Telecommunication Regulatory Agency \(NTRA\)](#).
- TEdData launched the "[Family Internet](#)" service to protect children from inappropriate content exposure on the web.
