• Signed and ratified, with no declarations or reservations to articles 16, 17(e) and 34(c), the <u>Convention on the Rights of the Child</u>.

# **UN PROTOCOL**

• Signed and ratified, with no declarations or reservations to articles 2 and 3, the <u>Optional</u> <u>Protocol to The Convention on the Rights of the Child on the Sale of Children, Child Prostitution</u> <u>and Child Pornography</u>.

## **INSTITUTIONAL SUPPORT**

- The <u>Illegal and Harmful Information Report Center (\*)</u>, under the Korean Communications Standards Commission (<u>KCSC (\*)</u>), works on the protection of internet users with the Korean National Police Agency, the Commission on Youth Protection, NGOs and ISPs.
- The <u>SafeNet (\*)</u> website, under <u>KCSC (\*)</u> introduced a rating system that allows content providers to rate and filter content according a selection made by parents and educators.

## **REPORTING MECHANISM**

• The <u>Illegal and Harmful Information Report Center</u>, a channel of the Korean Internet Safety Commission, receives report on illegal and harmful information.
