- <u>Section 22</u> of the Computer Misuse and Cybercrime Act, 2003 (Amends the Child Protection Act.)

#### **NATIONAL STRATEGY**

• Child Safety Online Action Plan.

#### **UN CONVENTION**

• Acceded to the <u>Convention on the Rights of the Child</u>, with no declarations or reservations to articles 16, 17(e) and 34(c).

#### **UN PROTOCOL**

Signed and ratified, with no declarations or reservations to articles 2 and 3, the <u>Optional</u>
 Protocol to The Convention on the Rights of the Child on the Sale of Children, Child

Prostitution and Child Pornography.

#### **INSTITUTIONAL SUPPORT**

- The Mauritian <u>ICT Authority</u> is responsible for regulating harmful and illegal online content. It has a procedure of content-filtering related to child sexual abuse websites.
- The National Computer Board (<u>NCB</u>), operating under the Ministry of Information and Communication Technologies (<u>MICT</u>) and part of the Cybersecurity Emergency Response Team (<u>CERT-MU</u>), has issued a <u>Child Safety Online Action Plan</u>.
- The NCB maintains a <u>website</u> dedicated to promote child safety online.
- The CERT-MU has a dedicated space to the information of young people and parents.

#### **REPORTINTG MECHANISM**

- The Mauritian ICT Authority provides an <u>online form</u> to report child sexual abuse images.
- The NCB also provides an <u>online form</u> to report cases related to children issues at Child Development Unit

These reporting mechanisms are not part of the INHOPE network.
