NATIONAL LEGISLATION

- <u>Section 235</u> of the Criminal Code *does not explicitly mention child pornography but obscene content.*
- <u>Sections 14-16</u> of the Informatic Offences (Combating) Act *does not explicitly mention child pornography but content that may affect public order or morals.*

UN CONVENTION

• Signed and ratified, with no declarations or reservations to articles 16, 17(e) and 34(c), the <u>Convention on the Rights of the Child</u>.

UN PROTOCOL

• Acceded to the <u>Optional Protocol to The Convention on the Rights of the Child on the Sale of</u> <u>Children, Child Prostitution and Child Pornography</u> with no declarations or reservations to articles 2 and 3.

INSTITUTIONAL SUPPORT
